The Church strongly encourages people to receive the Sacrament (Anointing) of the Sick at the early stages of serious sickness or before serious surgeries.

In emergency situations needing the prompt attention of a priest, please call the parish office.

MARRIAGE

Archdiocesan law requires advance notice of at least six months.

PARISH REGISTRATION

Newcomers to the parish may register in the Parish Office during regular office hours. Others, please notify the Parish Office of address changes. **Adults over 21** need to be registered as an individual member to be considered a Catholic in Good Standing.

Hearing devices are available for use during Mass. Please ask an usher for assistance.

Our Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) process will start in a few weeks. This journey of faith begins as you inquire about your God, your faith, and the Catholic Church through an interview or open question and answer sessions, video

presentations, information for more in-depth knowledge, and personal companions to walk with you on the journey!

No matter where you are on your journey of faith, we will assist you in becoming a "disciple of Christ" in the Catholic Church when the time is right for you. The process is filled with prayer, rituals, community support and spiritual gifts that last forever! The Our Lady Star of the Sea Community welcomes you. We pray that the Lord enlightens your path as you seek Him and serve Him in your life. Perhaps you know of someone you can invite to attend the sessions?

Perhaps that someone is you!? Maybe you know a neighbor or friend that has been thinking about "becoming Catholic." Watch this paper over the next few weeks and give us a call in the Parish Office. Remember – Christians are made, not born!


As we recall that Christians are made, it implies some work doesn't it? Just like anything else in our life, we have to "practice" if we want to be a good athlete, musician, dancer, technician, medical official, computer operator, mechanic, etc. We all have to "work" on our profession or passion for us to be "successful." The same with our faith. It takes some dedication and personal investment. Imagine you want to be a chef in a restaurant and you go into and apply for the job. They ask you, "what is your experience to be a chef?" and you reply, "I eat food." That does not exactly qualify you to become a chef. You need to apply yourself in the discipline of culinary arts and cooking. Our baptism, and receiving another sacrament or two, is only the beginning to becoming a christian and a disciple of Jesus, not the end or graduation. About today's hymns


Our opening hymn, "Love Divine, All Loves Excelling" (*Ritual Song*, no. 743), was written by Charles Wesley, an eighteenth century English priest who wrote more than 6,000 hymns. While many of his hymns were completely

original, some were re-writings of secular songs by others. This hymn is an example of this, as it is a reworking of a song by John Dryden from the fifth act of his opera *King Arthur*. Wesley's hymns are rich in scriptural allusions. Allusions in stanza one are Philippians 2: 5-11, John 1: 14, Isaiah 57: 15, Psalm 106: 4, and Deuteronomy 28: 65; and in the third stanza, 2 Corinthians 5: 17, Galatians 6: 5, 2 Peter 3: 14, Psalm 51: 12, Luke 2: 30, 2 Corinthians 3: 18, and Revelation 4: 10. The tune *Hyfrydol* is of Welsh origin, and its name is variously translated as "melodious, delightful, pleasant." It is interesting to not that the melody, with one exception, lies within the first five notes of the scale.

Our preparation hymn, "I want to walk as a child of the light" (*Ritual Song*, no. 651) was written in the summer of 1966, and was born out of a terrible heat wave that was gripping St. Louis when the author's mother came from Houston for a visit. A massive aircraft mechanics strike crippled the airline industry, and the only way for her mother to return home to Houston was by car. The words and melody came first while the author and her mother were busy packing for their trip, and the harmonies developed in during the long drive to Houston. Scriptural allusions in the first stanza include Ephesians 5: 8, Genesis 1: 16, Revelation 22: 16, and in the refrain I John 1: 5, Psalm 139: 12, Revelation 21: 23, and 2 Corinthians 4: 6. In the second stanza we have Malachi 4: 2, Psalm 119: 105, and John 14: 6; and in the third, I Corinthians 1: 7 and Hebrews 12: 1.

Our communion hymn, "I know that my Redeemer lives" (*Spirit Song*, no. 154), is based on Job 19, Psalm 27, and Isaiah 25. It was written by Scott Soper, a native of Maine and presently music development coordinator for the Oregon Catholic Press (OCP), the publisher of many sacred music collections and hymnals, including *Spirit Song*.

Our closing hymn, "Soon and very soon" (*Ritual Song*, no. 870), comes from the African-American tradition and was written and composed by Andrae Crouch, an American gospel singer, songwriter, arranger, record producer, and pastor. He is referred to as the father of modern gospel music. Because of his ability to incorporate contemporary secular music styles into the gospel music he grew up with he collaborated with many famous artists in the popular realm, including Stevie Wonder, Bob Dylan, Barbara Mandrell, Paul Simon, Elton John, and Elvis Presley. Scriptural allusions include Revelation 22: 7, 12, and 20, and Revelation 21: 4.

In the ancient disciple-rabbi relationship, the disciple would follow the



Dear Men,

We are very much in a time of testing. There is a certain "sifting" going on (Luke 22:31). Gone are the days when one could be carried along by the currents of a Christian culture. Yet, these are glorious days to be alive. Days when we are being called to make a conscious effort to follow the Lord. These are days in which we must, in essence, be *men*. St. Pope John Paul II tells us that one only finds himself by giving himself. It is a man's calling to give himself, following the pattern of Jesus Christ, and by doing so to lead others to our Lord and Savior.

One group that I find particularly good for the life of Catholic men is The Knights of Columbus. Founded in 1882 by Blessed Father Michael J. McGivney, The Knights of Columbus provide Catholic men the opportunity to live their faith through charitable works, caring for their families and defending the Catholic faith.

My father, brothers, and I were part of the group that chartered the Knights of Columbus council at our home parish back in 1991. It has been my experience that the Knights contribute to the strength of families, and of parishes, among many other things. The Knights also play a crucial role in financial support for our seminarians, and often act as a stepping stone for those discerning the priesthood, as a great number of priests were knights *before* entering seminary.

I strongly encourage all men in our archdiocese, who are at least 18 years old, to prayerfully consider joining a Knights of Columbus council. As our young people feel more and more isolated, being involved in a council is a wonderful way to build authentic Catholic community among men. In The Knights of Columbus, I know you will find a warm welcome among the men who share your love for the Church.



Stewardship Thoughts

Faith in God connects today's Scripture readings. In the Book of Wisdom, God grants those who are faithful boldness against their foes. The Letter to the Hebrews teaches us that faith is the realization of what is hoped for and evidence of things not seen. In St. Luke's Gospel, our Lord, alluding to His final coming, professes: Blessed are those servants whom the master finds vigilant on his arrival. These faithfilled servants will not be caught off guard because they have trusted and put their faith in our Lord and Savior. Jesus calls us to discipleship — to faith — beginning with our Baptism. Throughout our life, Jesus continues to knock at the door of our hearts. Will we let Him in, personalizing our relationship with Him? 
