Tomorrow, Monday, August 15, is the Solemnity of the Assumption of Mary. This is the day that we celebrate Our Blessed Mother being assumed into heaven, body and soul. Normally, it is one of the days in the United States that is listed as a Holyday of Obligation. HOWEVER, many years ago, the US Bishops decided that when August 15 (the Assumption of Mary), November 1 (All Saints), and January 1 (Mary, Mother of

God) fall on a Saturday or Monday, the <u>obligation</u> is lifted but the Solemnity, or the "holyday," still exists. So...this year, Monday, as we celebrate the Assumption of Mary, people are NOT OBLIGATED to participate in Mass. Therefore, we will have only one Mass on Monday at our regular daily Mass time at 7:30 am. For those who would still like to participate in a Mass later, see page 14 for Mass times at our neighboring parishes.

I know this arrangement, of sometimes these days are of obligation and sometimes they are not, is very confusing, [I think some often use this as an excuse to never participate at Mass on Holidays of obligation.] When the US bishops decided this arrangement many years ago, it was responding to a practical, and probably realistic, actuality of what was happening in most parishes. Unfortunately, people were just not coming to church and participating in these holydays. Maybe some simply did not understand the great significance of these solemnities or feasts and chose to not go to Mass. The other reality was the extra burden placed upon the liturgical ministers, i.e., the lectors, musicians, etc. especially when additional Masses were planned the day before or after all the weekend liturgies. As important as these three solemnities (Assumption, All Saints, and Mary, Mother of God) are, the bishops kept only the solemnity of the Immaculate Conception, our Patroness of the US, as always attached with the duty of obligation. So when that holyday (Dec. 8) falls on a Saturday or a Monday, it still remains a day of obligation because of its significance to the US Church. The Bishops are not necessarily downgrading the other "holydays" but simply acknowledging the challenges when they fall on either side of the Sunday liturgies. ** This Thursday, Aug. 18, the parish office will be closed, as well as next Thursday, Aug. 25.

** In the next few weeks, the very large yellow and green paper recycling containers that have been by the school library will be removed. When they were brought on to our campus 14 years ago, we were receiving considerable money (hundreds of dollars) in exchange for all the paper that was collected for recycling. A few weeks ago we received a check for \$14 for the quarter with a total of about \$100 for the whole year. We have been examining the various safety factors with the large dumpsters there, especially with recess during the school year. We also realize the available opportunities for people to recycle at their own house in our cities. So we decided to have them removed for the safety of our children playing in that area during recess because there is not another place these dumpsters can be located. If you want to help a member of our "family of parishes" instead of recycling at your house, St. Joan of Arc has multiple yellow and green containers on their property. I am sure they will be delighted to accept your paper donations.

Jusic Notes from Glenn Miller

About today's hymns

Our opening hymn, "As we gather at your table" (Ritual Song, no. 848) was written by the Reverend Dr. Carl

P. Daw Jr., one of the leading figures in American hymnody in the past forty years. In addition to his experience as a parish priest and university chaplain, he served as the Executive Director of the Hymn Society in the United States and Canada and served as Professor of Hymnology in the Master of Sacred Music Program at Boston University School of Theology. He has written five volumes of hymns and three volumes of liturgical music for the lectionary. The tune, Nettleton, is an American folk hymn which dates from the nineteenth century. The shape of this tune is easy to discern; the first, second and fourth phrases are exactly the same, and the third phrase basically repeats the same melodic pattern twice, which makes it very easy to learn this tune. It is also interesting to note that the tune is hexatonic, which means that uses only six notes of the eight-note scale. The tune is named after a nineteenth century evangelist, Asahel Nettleton.

Our closing hymn, "Hail, Queen of Heaven, the Ocean Star" (inside back cover of *Ritual Song*) is being sung today in anticipation of The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary, which is on Monday, August 15. This hymn was written by Fr. John Lingard (1771-1851), an English Roman Catholic priest and historian, and was the author of *The History of England, From* the First Invasion by the Romans to the Accession of Henry VIII, an eightvolume work published in 1819. In addition to his vocation as a priest and historian, he helped smooth the passage of the Catholic Emancipation Act in England. The act involved reducing and removing many of the restrictions on Catholics in the United Kingdom which had been imposed by the Act of Uniformity of 1662, the Act which had established the Church of England.

This hymn is based on the medieval Latin plainchant Ave maris stella ("Hail, Star of the Sea.") The tune's name, Stella, comes from the village of that name near Newcastle-upon-Tyne where its composer was the organist in a local church.

Our Lady, Star of the Sea is an ancient title for the Virgin Mary. The words Star of the Sea are a translation of the Latin title Stella Maris. The

title has been in use since at least the early medieval period. Purportedly arising from a scribal error in a supposed etymology of the name Mary, it came to be seen as allegorical of Mary's role as "guiding star" on the way to Christ. Under this name, the Virgin Mary intercedes as a guide and protector of seafarers in particular. The name stella maris has an interesting history, and is first applied to the Virgin Mary in the manuscript tradition of Saint Jerome's Latin translation of the *Onomasticon* by Eusebius of Caesarea, though this is in fact a misnomer based on a transcription error. For reaching this meaning the Hebrew name ממרים at transcription error. For reaching this meaning the Hebrew name interpreted Maryām as mar-yam (" (מר-ים) adrop of the sea", based on מר a rare biblical word for "drop". St Jerome adopted this interpretation and translated the name into Latin as stilla maris, "drop of the sea", but at some later stage a copyist transcribed this into stella maris, "star of the sea", and this transcription error became widespread. Another opinion states that Jerome himself interpreted the name as meaning "star of the sea" or Stella Maris, by relating it to a Hebrew word for star,) מאור ('ama'or), from the verb 'חסאור, to be light or shine. The nautical parallel in this hymn also is connected to the word "nave", used to describe the main body of a church, which is from the medieval Latin word navis, meaning "ship", possibly with some reference to the "Ship of St Peter" or the Ark of Noah. Catherine of Siena described the Church as a ship. The image was transferred to the individual travelling on life's stormy or tempestuous seas.




WATCH THE WOMAN



Stewardship Thoughts

Today's Scripture passages profess difficult messages. The leaders in Jeremiah's time wrongly accuse the prophet of ruining the people by encouraging them to transform their lives. In turn, they desire to punish Jeremiah. In St. Luke's Gospel, the evangelist proclaims Jesus' statement: I have come to set the earth on fire and how I wish it were already blazing! Christ's message produces tension and division among family members instead of peace and harmony. As faithful stewards, our strength to seek God's will against all resistance to His Word comes from sacramental grace. The Eucharist, notably, is the "source and summit" of our faith. As described in the Letter to the Hebrews, grace allows us to persevere in running the race ... while keeping our eyes fixed on Jesus. Healing among family members begins with and through Christ's message of forgiveness found in the Sacrament of Reconciliation.




