It is that time of the year again. Families are starting to wrap up most of their summer activities and vacations. Some of our students will be starting school this week or next. Others right after Labor Day. The present days can be filled with anxiety with new adventures and situations laden with the unknown. They can also be filled with excitement because of new adventures and situations

We are all different in the way we approach and respond to life situations. The one constant we have is the Lord's love and abundant care for us. Our psalm response (Psalm 40) last Sunday is a good one to remember: "Lord, come to my aid...The Lord heard my cry. He drew me out of the pit of destruction...And he put a new song into my mouth...Many shall look on in awe and trust in the Lord...You are my help and my deliverer; O my God, hold not back!"

Our hope and trust in the Lord is something that should be a bedrock in our life. We trust in Him that He does provide for us...."give us this day our daily bread." Remembering though "thy will be done." I am sure we have all had our times when we think the Lord is not listening to us because we are not getting our way and what we are requesting of God. But when we remember "thy will be done" it gives us assurance that God does provide for us at the right time and exactly when we need.

Our faith and trust in God, and the understanding of His abiding presence in our life, can give us so much peace. I heard a lady say one time that she puts on this certain "essential oil" when she knows she might have a little more stressful day than normal. While the oils might smell nice, it is no substitute for the peace and understanding we receive from our good relationship with God, that living presence within us, strengthened when we receive Him in Holy Communion. That is an abiding everlasting presence within us and does not fade as some oil or fragrance does!

- ** If you know family members, friends, neighbors or acquaintances who have inquired about the Catholic faith and want to know more, please invite them to come to Mass sometime or call the parish office to set up an appointment to talk more. We like to talk to those who in interested in becoming Catholic and explain the process how that happens. Likewise, maybe you have not seen someone at Mass for some time. Invite them to return and become reacquainted with our community, the Church and Jesus!
- ** Monday is the Queenship of our Blessed Mother. I invite you and your family to pray the rosary that day. Also consider joining us Thursday (weather permitting) at 7:30 pm for our outdoor rosary! Certainly bring a lawn chair or blanket for your comfort.

Some thoughts about singing in community

This past June when I was traveling in Jerusalem on the Rachmaninov Vespers performance and recording tour and pilgrimage, one of the things that struck me yet again was the very essence of singing together in community, whether it be in a choir or in

the congregational assembly or in a religious community. Our rehearsals and recording sessions were on the Mount of Olives where today there is a convent. Each day we had our lunch with the nuns in their refectory, and at the beginning and the end of each meal there was singing. The singing by the nuns was very gentle and unassuming, an act which, coupled with their daily acts of worship which measured out the hours of the day, bind them together as a community. Simple voices bound together in faith, usually singing a simple melody or chant, sometimes in harmony but more often in unison. And in their liturgies (as is the case in the Orthodox tradition), everything is sung as singing is regarded as the voice of heaven, whereas speaking is of this world, so by singing one is taken out of this world.

Culturally we have become less and less a singing a society. This erosion is nothing new. Before the advent of radio, television, and all of the technology we have, singing in community was commonplace, a primary way to fill one's time, whether gathered around the dinner table or traveling or working, all a means to pass down from generation to generation one's culture and the faith.

One of the things that struck me most was how when we gathered during our Jerusalem pilgrimage was how the people in our group from other cultures would simply start to sing, whether it be folksongs in a pub or hymns at a shrine. I always felt a bit embarrassed that the best we from our culture could do was "Row, row, row your boat" or "Happy birthday" compared to the inexhaustible well of music that they sang from memory. Their singing in these impromptu gatherings was always lusty (in the pub) or deeply spiritual (at the various shrines). No one cared about how one sounded; it was all about community and is was simply what you did.

Today it is the case that labels are attached to people as those who "can" or "cannot" sing, especially with children. Singing and matching pitch are however skills that are learned, just as how one learns to kick a soccer ball or ride a bicycle or learn to play an instrument. Much of the singing culture we experience today is solo-based and certainly not corporate, which really is contrary to what the psalmist extols us to do in when gathered for worship. "O come, let us sing to the Lord..." (Psalm 95), or as a favorite hymn of mine reminds us, "...let all rejoice who have a voice to raise!" And thereby we are bound together in community, with the sum of all the voices joined together being far greater than that of one singing alone. In singing together one not only is called upon to contribute one's unique sound but more importantly is called upon to listen to each other and to how God is speaking in and through this act. And therein lies one of the fundamentals of building up the Church and society. It is all part of the work of the assembly – the liturgy, a word which is derived from the technical term from the Greek words, leitourgia, which literally means "work for the people." We all have a part to play in this work, this activity, this offering of ourselves.

One of the greatest joys I have here at Star is warming up the school students in the church before school mass on Fridays. As the year progressed last year the children grew in their skill and confidence; they found their voice, the sound blossomed, and their participation in the Holy Mass brought heavenly dimension and life and community, giving God glory.

So back to our singing together as a community in worship – first, one of the things that gives me joy personally as I accompany the assembly is hearing the voice of the community, and how your voice is simply beautiful and has grown increasingly confident and present. The energy and sound when I hear you sing favorites is inspiring, as it especially was this past Sunday when we sang as the last hymn "Hail, Queen of Heaven, the Ocean Star," the hymn which has special ties to this

community. When a hymn is less familiar, it is likewise inspiring to hear how with each successive stanza the singing gets stronger and more confident. Often times after daily mass (such a great way to start the day!) someone will say to me, "that hymn we sang today, what a discovery and a treasure it is!" In this discovery a new miracle is revealed, a manifestation of God's ongoing act of creation, revealing something previously unknown or underscoring something already known about the nature of God, and a piece of heaven which was once hidden is made visible, even for a moment. Every hymn once was new to each and every one of us.

The most important thing to remember is that a hymn is prayer and that we understand it best when we do it ourselves. It may take a bit of bravery, but be brave, take a deep breath when it is time to sing, and go for it. The forest would be a very quiet place if the birds didn't sing. "He who sings prays twice."

Stewardship Thoughts

God's saving power of salvation is inclusive. After missionaries minister to the Gentile nations, the prophet Isaiah professes that even some pagan converts will be allowed into Israel's holy, priestly order of Levites. Our Second Reading, from the Letter to the Hebrews, tells us that ...whom the Lord loves, He disciplines. This is analogous to a father disciplining his children with love. In the Gospel, the evangelist St. Luke is clear, through Jesus's teaching, that eternal salvation is not guaranteed. Those who become devoted disciples, even if not first to hear the Word of God, will be first in the Kingdom; those who are first to hear His Word but do not take it seriously will be last. 




