Music Notes
from Glenn Miller

About today's hymns

Our opening hymn, "All Creatures of Our God and King" (*Ritual Song*, no. 670) was written by St Francis of Assisi in 1225, a year before his death. It was originally titled, "Altissimu, omnipotente, bon signore," known as "Canticle of the Sun" and is the oldest surviving religious poem in Italian. St Francis was blind and quite ill when he wrote this hymn. He wrote the first three stanzas when he was living in a small hut in the monastery gardens; the living conditions of the hut however were less than ideal because of not only the heat but also because of an infestation of mice. After his health improved somewhat he moved out of the hut where he wrote the fifth stanza, which speaks of forgiveness and bearing pain, and is in connection with a quarrel between the bishop of Assisi and the local magistrates. The sixth stanza, in which he speaks of death, is believed to have been written shortly before he died. The final stanza speaks of worshipping God "in humbleness," one of the themes of today's Gospel lesson. The tune dates from the early sixteenth century, and is of German origin.

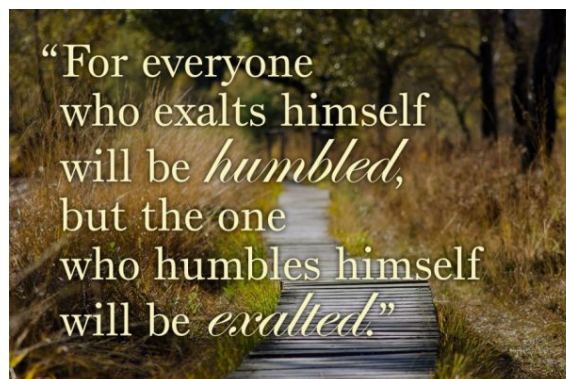
The preparation hymn, "With All I Am," (*Spirit Song*, no. 212) was written and composed by Mike Nelson and Anthony Perna in 1997. The text of the refrain also reflects one of the theme's of today's Gospel lesson.

Our Communion hymn, "Life-giving Bread, Saving Cup," (*Ritual Song*, no. 920) is an adaptation of a text from the *Didache*, a brief anonymous early Christian treatise written in Koine Greek, dated by modern scholars to the first or second century. The text, parts of which constitute the oldest extant written catechism, has three main sections dealing with Christian ethics, rituals such as baptism and Eucharist, and Church organization. The composer, James Chepponis, is a priest of the Pittsburgh diocese, where he is a senior parochial vicar and Diocesan Director of Music. In 1999, Fr. Chepponis was appointed Music Director at Pittsburgh's St. Paul Cathedral, where he served as choir director and worked to expand the cathedral's music ministry. He has over sixty published liturgical compositions and has also published articles on liturgy.

The closing hymn, "Lead Me, Lord" (*Spirit Song*, no. 107), was written and composed by John Becker, who, while earning music degrees, became involved in liturgical ensemble music and began composing music for liturgy. After spending thirteen years as music minister at Guardian Angels Church in Oakdale, Minnesota, he pursued a law degree and is now a legal editor, though he remains active as a choir member and lay preacher. The verses of this hymn are based on Matthew 5: 3-12 (The Beatitudes) and 7: 7, 13; and the refrain is based on John 14: 6.

Looking ahead...

The Star Choir resumes its weekly rehearsals on Wednesday, September 7. Rehearsal time is from 7:30 to 9:00 p.m.; the choir sings weekly at the 11:30 Sunday mass. For details, speak with Mr. Miller.

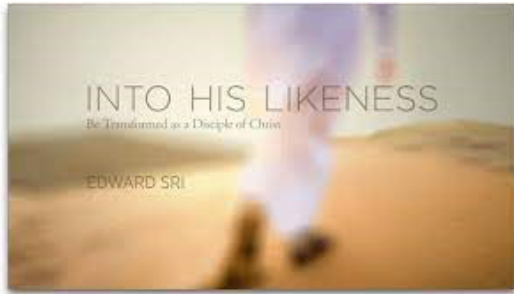

In the ancient disciple-rabbi relationship, the disciple would follow the rabbi so closely that he would be covered in the dust kicked from his rabbi's feet. Thousands of years later, though we walk on roads of pavement and not dust, we are still called to be disciples and follow our Rabbi, Jesus Christ, so closely that we are covered with his life, changed and made new.

In this study, **Into His Likeness**, Dr. Edward Sri reminds us that the earliest disciples were models not of perfection, but of a process. It is that process that Jesus wants us to reproduce in our lives today. This study helps you to follow the initial promptings of the Holy Spirit so that you may intentionally encounter Jesus every day and be more transformed into his likeness

This study is presented in 6 sessions starting 9/28 and running through 11/2.

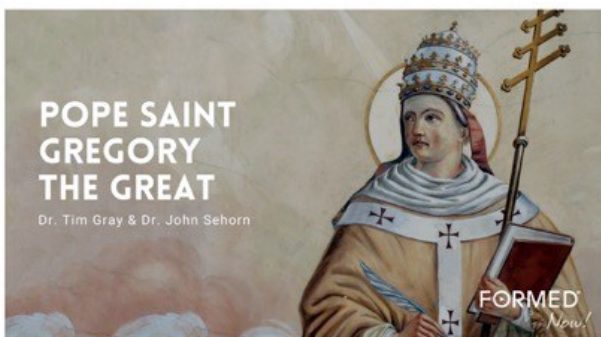
INTO THE BREACH – EPISODE 3: LEADERSHIP

FORMED NOW: POPE SAINT GREGORY THE GREAT

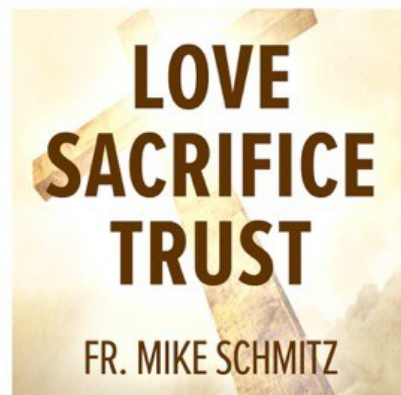

Stewardship Thoughts

The topic of humility is articulated in today's First Reading and St. Luke's Gospel. The Scripture passage from Sirach indicates that the humble person is loved, God-favored, and able to atone for sins through the giving of alms. In the Gospel, Jesus narrates a parable about humility to expose the arrogant Pharisees: ... *everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, but the one who humbles himself will be exalted.* Faithful stewards humbly recognize God as the source and giver of all gifts, and strive to be God-dependent. We exhibit true humility when we discern and find His will instead of following our own. It is in unison with God's will that we find true joy, peace, and happiness in this world. Humility occurs when we serve other's needs before our own in Corporal Works of Mercy without the expectation of repayment. These acts of stewardship — sacrificing our time, talent, and treasure for others — help build God's Kingdom here and pave the way to eternal joy.

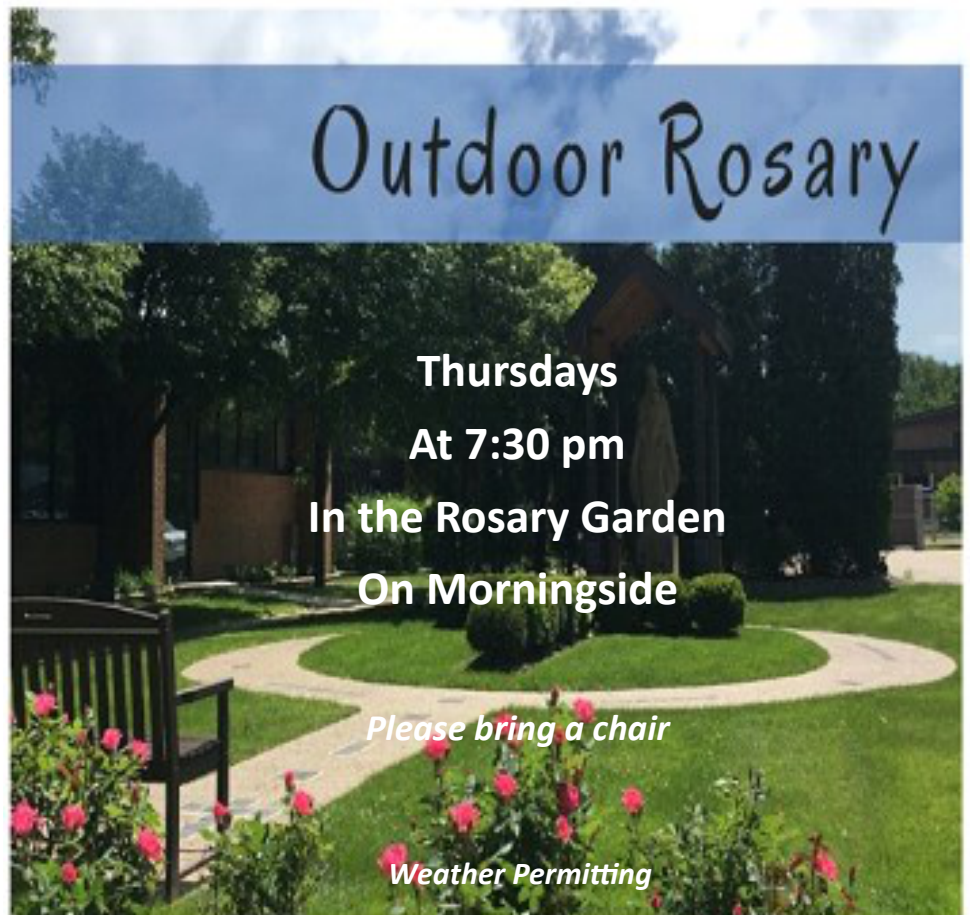
