Opposing Proposal 3

In Last weeks bulletin, we discussed Proposal 3 (the "Reproductive Freedom for All" proposal), and how it will amend Michigan's Constitution to create a startling broad right to abortion. In the first article

we learned that the proposal's broad language (giving the right to "every individual") authorizes a minor to obtain an abortion without parental consent or notice. In the second article, we learned that the same would be true if a minor sought a sterilization procedure, and that the proposal would also authorize partial-birth abortion. Proposal 3's supporters say that the State will still be able to regulate abortion "after fetal viability." But that is grossly misleading. The proposal specifically allows abortion through all nine months of pregnancy—notwithstanding any contrary Michigan law—if an abortionist decides, in his professional judgment, that an abortion is necessary to protect the "physical or mental health" of the mother. As a legal matter, such a "mental health" exception is widely acknowledged to be so broad as to justify abortion on demand until birth. An abortionist need merely document that the prospect of having a child is causing extreme anxiety and stress for the mother. And while Proposal 3 supporters say a judge won't have to allow such a broad exception, the proposal's language specifically requires courts to defer to the abortionist's "professional judgment." No matter how a voter feels about abortion, Michigan's Constitution should not be amended to allow abortion on demand through all nine months of pregnancy. Please tell everyone you know: vote "NO" on Proposal 3 on November 8th. John Bursch is a constitutional lawyer and former Michigan Solicitor General. Through Alliance Defending Freedom, he represents the Michigan Catholic Conference and Right to Life of Michigan in court to uphold Michigan's pro-life laws.



A committee called Reproductive Freedom for All (RFFA) is working to amend the Michigan Constitution. Led by Planned Parenthood and the ACLU, this committee's amendment would create a new unlimited and unregulated right to abortion in our state. This radical proposal is not about reproductive freedom, which already exists. This poorly worded amendment would repeal dozens of state laws, including laws unrelated to abortion. It could affect any law related to pregnancy and abortion and does not exempt minor children. Vote **NO** on **proposal 3** this November.

The following state laws are at risk:

- Parental consent for abortion
- Ban on school employees helping children have abortions
- Laws requiring parental consent for medical treatment related to pregnancy, including sterilizations and hormone therapy
- Late-term abortion bans

- Requirement that only doctors perform abortion
- Conscience protections for doctors/nurses who object to abortions
- Ban on tax-funded abortions
- Michigan's original 1846 and revised 1931 abortion ban
- Bans on statutory rape and incest


John XXIII: The Pope of Peace

About today's hymns

Our opening hymn, "Praise, My Soul, the King of Heaven" (*Ritual Song*, no. 684) is a paraphrase of Psalm 103 written by Henry Francis Lyte. Lyte deserted an early intention to pursue a medical career for the priesthood. This was sung as the procession-

al hymn of the wedding of Queen Elizabeth II, and as a result became one of the most popular English hymns. The tune was composed for this text, and its name, *Lauda anima*, is Latin for "Praise, my soul."

Our presentation hymn, "Keep in Mind" (*Ritual Song*, no. 940) is based on today's second reading, II Timothy 2: 8-14. It was written and composed by Lucien Deiss CSS, a French Catholic priest, biblical exegete and liturgical composer. Entering the Congregation of the Holy Ghost in 1942, Deiss composed over 400 liturgical compositions. Passionate about the Bible and liturgy, he was initially professor of Holy Scripture at the major seminary of Brazzaville, Congo. He was a specialist in biblical exegesis and he formerly occupied the Chair of Sacred Scripture and Dogmatic Theology at the Grand Scholasticat des Peres du Saint-Esprit in Paris. He was heavily involved in the liturgical reform of the Lectionary during Vatican II and was a member of the Concilium on Liturgy. As a missionary priest, he gave retreats and worked with the poor in several nations of the world, including Africa, Haiti and Taiwan, for many years.

Fr. Lucien wrote hundreds of liturgical songs and hymns, and for this he is best known in the United States.

Our communion hymn, "I Am the Bread of Life" (*Ritual Song*, no. 931) was written and composed by Sister Suzanne Toolan in 1966 for the Archdiocese of San Francisco, and is a rendering of verses from John 6. Born in Lansing, Michigan, Sister Suzanne moved to Hollywood at 17, before she became a professed Sister of Mercy. She earned a master's degree in humanities and then began her teaching career, directing choirs for high schools, colleges, parish, and seminaries. She continued her music studies, which included composition work at Michigan State University, liturgical study at the University of Notre Dame, and choral work with Robert Shaw at San Diego State University. A prominent American spokeswoman for the music and prayer of the Taizé ecumenical community from France having brought the music and prayer of the Taizé ecumenical community from France to the Mercy Center in 1982, she leads many Taizé-style retreats. Sister Suzanne attributes the popularity of "I Am the Bread of Life," which has been translated into 20 languages, to its "message of resurrection, which is so strong in these words of Jesus. We so need that message of hope." On her 80th birthday, she released an autobiography, *I Am the Bread of Life*, which includes the story behind her beloved hymn. Sister Suzanne is the resident liturgist and directs Taizé prayer at Mercy Center, a ministry of the Sisters of Mercy in Burlingame, California.

Our closing hymn, "I Danced in the Morning" (*Ritual Song*, no. 809) was written by English song writer Sydney Carter in 1963. Carter was a leader in the church folk song movement of the 1960's. The text is naturally thick with biblical references, with allusions in almost every line. It is also helpful to keep in mind that this hymn affirms what could be called a Dance of Life in opposition to the Dance of Death motif that received much attention in European culture from the late Middle Ages onward, emphasizing instead that the Good News centers on the gift of life. About this hymn Carter wrote: *I see Christ as the incarnation of the piper who is calling us. He dances that shape and pattern which is at the heart of our reality... I sing of the dancing pattern in the life and words of Jesus. Whether Jesus ever leaped in Galilee to the rhythm of a pipe or drum I do not know. We are told that David danced (and as an act of worship too), so it is not impossible.*


