MARRIAGE

Archdiocesan law requires advance notice of at least six months.

Newcomers to the parish may register in the Parish Office during regular office hours. Others, please notify the Parish Office of address changes. **Adults over 21** need to be registered as an individual member to be considered a Catholic in Good Standing.

Believe it or not here we are at the end of October and the start of November already. The falling leaves and the change of season certainly remind us that the earth in this part of our world is starting to fade away and ready to go dormant. November has also traditionally been a time in the Church when we pause and become more mindful of our beloved faithful departed. The Church provides very fitting readings as

we will hear more about the end of time and harvesting of all the souls by God.

Tomorrow is All Hallows Eve, or as many call it, Halloween. The noun "hallow" means a holy person or saint. Back in the 8th century, Pope Gregory III dedicated a chapel in St. Peter's Basilica to all the saints. Pope Gregory IV then made the feast day for all the saints universal and made November 1 the day to celebrate All Hallows (All Saints). Later, anticipating this feast, people started calling October 31 All Hallows Eve, which then eventually morphed into "Halloween." While we do not think today so much of Halloween as an extension of All Saints Day, we certainly can get back to those roots!

God's saints come in all sizes, shapes, colors and ages. Some saints are remembered and known by name, officially recognized by the Church. However, most saints are unknown to us. Think of the people you would call a "saint," because of their lived holiness and personal witness. So Tuesday, **All Saints Day**, we celebrate the countless unknown and uncelebrated saints who have done the work of God in every age. Mass on this **Holyday of Obligation** are at 7:30 am, 10 am, and 7 pm.

Wednesday, November 2, is **All Souls Day**, a companion feast to All Saints day. All Souls Day is a solemn memorial for all the departed Christians who were not exemplary saints or martyrs. On All Saints Day we celebrated, for our benefit, our union with those holy men and women whose good deed can assist us on this earthly journey. On All Souls Day, we ask that our prayers may somehow assist those who have died, especially those in Purgatory. On All Souls Day evening, we will gather as a parish for a special **Mass of Remembrance**. At this Mass, we will remember in a special way, through the reading of names, all those buried from Our Lady Star of the Sea during the last 12 months. This special Mass of Remembrance is at 7 pm. All are invited. We will also remember all those who are inscribed in the Book of Life. [The Book of Life is available today so that you may inscribe the names of your departed loved ones who have died during the past year. *The names inscribed during the previous year are still in the book so please do not duplicate names*]. Everyone is invited to this special evening Mass and pray for all the faithful departed. Please consider it!



Prayer for Life and Right Laws



Almighty ever-living God, you bestow the gift of life as you form each of us in our mother's womb. Look on our nation, state, and community and awaken in every heart reverence for life. Protect our state from unjust laws. In your Name, bring to defeat every attack against the sacredness of life. Safeguard the rights of parents, whom you have entrusted with the care and formation of their children. Help all who believe in Jesus to proclaim the Gospel of Life to their neighbors. Dispel every anxiety and fear. Strengthen the bond between parents and their unborn child. May mothers and fathers accept and nurture the gift of life made in your image and likeness. Our Lady, Queen of the Family, pray for us!

St. Michael the Archangel, pray for us! St. Joseph, Protector of the Unborn, pray for us



This is now our 6th week discussing the startlingly broad language of Proposal 3 (the "Reproductive Freedom for All" proposal). In addition to violating the Church's teaching that every human life is sacred and must be protected from conception, the proposal allows minors to obtain sterilizations as well as abortions without parental consent or even notice, effectively allows abortion on demand through 9 months of pregnancy, prevents the State from protecting unborn life or stopping discrimination

based on a baby's sex, race, or disability, and effectively exempts abortionists from health and safety regulations. It gets worse. In subsection (3), Proposal 3 says that the state shall not "penalize, prosecute, or otherwise take adverse action against someone for aiding or assisting" a mother in obtaining an abortion. That means if a teacher or counselor takes a student to obtain an abortion without notifying the child's parents, there are no legal consequences. If someone assists with an abortion—even if they have no medical license or training whatsoever—there can also be no legal consequences. Most bizarrely, if an abortionist engages in gross negligence and severely harms or kills the mother as well as her child during an abortion, he will have a constitutional defense to any malpractice claim: Michigan's Constitution would prevent the State from imposing an "adverse action," i.e., a state-court judgment, against him. No matter how a voter feels about abortion, Michigan's Constitution should not be amended to allow non-medical providers to assist in abortions and to absolve abortionists of medical-malpractice liability. Please tell everyone you know: vote "NO" on Proposal 3 on November 8th. John Bursch is a constitutional lawyer and former Michigan Solicitor General. Through Alliance Defending Freedom, he represents the Michigan Catholic Conference and Right to Life of Michigan in court to uphold Michigan's pro-life laws.


