Here we are in November, the time in the Church to traditionally pray for the faithful departed. We pray for their happy repose and allow our prayers and sacrifices to assist their purification in purgatory, preparing for the glory of heaven. As much as we might not like to think or talk about it, the topic of death will be frequent in our readings during November, when we hear more about the end of time and meeting the Lord. It is not a bad idea to think about our pending death (pending here

does not have to mean very soon) because that is reality that will come true!

Last weekend Mitch Albom had an article in the Free Press about funerals. He mentioned the visits he would have to a cemetery to "visit" departed loved ones. He knows he should arrange for his final resting place soon. He also spoke of a new trend, i.e., not burying or cremating our bodies for a final resting place but letting them become compost. Yes, you are reading that correctly. He described the process and then said "no thank you" as an option for him. (I am sure the Church will also agree!)

It also seems an appropriate time to provide some education or formation regarding funerals in the Catholic church. Our parish office very often gets questions about funerals so answering some of those can be informative. Here are just a few...

"Do we have to create and put together a funeral service?" No. The Church's ritual, *The Order of Christian Funerals*, has it all done. It is a beautiful liturgy for all member of the Church, whether a person is a prince or pauper. The main elements are the Vigil, the Funeral Liturgy (either Mass or outside of Mass), and the Rite of Committal. It is important to remember the funeral liturgy is a prayer, entrusting the deceased to the Mercy of God, not a time to recall the accolades of a person's life. Great reverence is given the body, made holy from the day of our Baptism. In this prayer, the body is sprinkled with holy water and incensed.

"Can a person be cremated?" Yes, the Church allows for cremation, but the first preference is for the body to be present for the funeral with cremation afterwards.

"What do we do with the cremated remains after?" The cremated remains are to be treated with the same utmost respect as the body. They are to be buried or entombed. The practice of scattering cremated remains in the sea, on the ground, dividing the remains, or keeping the remains in the home are not the reverent disposition that the church requires.

"Are eulogies permitted?" Eulogies, words that pay tribute to the deceased through stories or anecdotes, are not allowed during the funeral liturgy. God already knows the person's life! Our task is to pray for the person. An appropriate place for eulogies offered by friends or family would be during the visitation at the funeral home, after the Committal, or certainly at a funeral luncheon.

"Can I make funeral plans ahead of time? My family are not church goers, but I would like to have a proper funeral." Yes, you can pre-plan funerals with a funeral home and likewise have your wishes and selections for your funeral liturgy on file with the parish. You can also appoint a personal funeral representative, registered with the State of Michigan, that has the total authority to make decisions regarding your funeral arrangements and final resting place. This can guarantee that your funeral arrangement and wishes are fulfilled. (A funeral home can assist you with this process.)

\*\* Many important issues are presented to the electorate this Tuesday. I invite you to come to our Holy Hour Monday night at 7:30 pm, asking the Lord and the Holy Spirit to be with all of us who are making choices regarding our future in terms of governance and morals. Don't forget to check our website for the many resources available revealing the confusing and damaging effect of passing proposal 3.





## **Prayer for Life and Right Laws**

Almighty ever-living God,

you bestow the gift of life as you form each of us in our mother's womb.

Look on our nation, state, and community

and awaken in every heart

reverence for life.

Protect our state from unjust laws.

In your Name, bring to defeat

every attack against the sacredness of life. Safe-

This is our 7th and final week to review the actual language of Proposal 3 (the "Reproductive Freedom for All" proposal). Unsurprisingly, the proposal violates Church teaching about the sacredness of all human life beginning at conception. Shockingly, the proposal also authorizes minors to obtain abortions and sterilizations without parental consent or even notice, effectively allows abortion on demand through 9 months of pregnancy, prevents the State from protecting unborn life or stopping discrimination based on a baby's sex, race, or disability,

effectively exempts abortionists from health and safety regulations, and permits non-medical professionals to assist with abortions while potentially absolving abortionists from medical-malpractice lawsuits. Is it any surprise that Proposal 3's supporters did not publish the proposal's full text on their website until after petition signature gathering was over? There are plenty of additional provisions of Proposal 3 that we could address, but we only have time for one more. Subsection (2) says that the "state shall not discriminate in the protection or enforcement of this fundamental right." The Michigan Supreme Court has previously held that Michigan can limit taxpayer funding for abortions. But supreme courts of Alaska, California, Massachusetts, Minnesota, and New Jersey have all held that an independent state constitutional right to abortion means the state cannot restrict public funding of abortions. And Proposal 3's anti-discrimination law makes it a near certainty the same will happen here. So not only will abortion on demand be the law in Michigan, but all of us will likely have to pay for it—even if it violates our deepest religious beliefs about the value and dignity of unborn, human life. No matter how a voter feels about abortion, Proposal 3 is terrifying. This extreme proposal would make Michigan an outlier, not only in the United States but around the world. And the Michigan Legislature and courts would have very few tools to do anything to combat the proposal's language, which appears intentionally overbroad. Please tell everyone you know: vote "NO" on Proposal 3 on November 8th. John Bursch is a constitutional lawyer and former Michigan Solicitor General. Through Alliance Defending Freedom, he represents the Michigan Catholic Conference and Right to Life of Michigan in court to uphold Michigan's pro-life laws.

## **Stewardship Thoughts**

The theme of Resurrection connects today's Scripture readings. In the Second Book of Maccabees, seven brothers and their mother are martyred for refusing to deny their religious convictions. Before death, the fourth brother proclaims: It is my choice to die ... with the hope God gives of being raised up (in the resurrection of the dead). In the Gospel from St. Luke, the Sadducees, who do not accept the idea of the resurrection, confront Jesus. Christ replies that those united in marriage will not be married in the next world. He states: ... for they are like angels; and they are like the children of God. Jesus further professes that God is the God of the living as referred to by Moses at the burning bush, indicating the existence of an afterlife. After Christ's second coming, there is also a resurrection of the dead. Faithful stewards are comforted and given hope in their belief of eternal life and resurrection, not only for the living, but also for those loved ones who have passed to the Lord. Are we, as Christ's disciples, willing to defend, like the seven brothers, our faith against a hostile secular world? Call or email your state and federal representatives when laws at odds with Catholic teaching are proposed or passed.


