MARRIAGE

Archdiocesan law requires advance notice of at least six months.

Newcomers to the parish may register in the Parish Office during regular office hours. Others, please notify the Parish Office of address changes. **Adults over 21** need to be registered as an individual member to be considered a Catholic in Good Standing.

These final weeks of the liturgical year, which ends when Advent begins at the end of the month, bring our attention to the end of time or Judgement Day. When listening to today's Gospel, there can be some fear in our hearts, especially as Jesus describes people being against each other, nations against nations, wars and insurrections, devasting actions against God's people. At the end of this

Gospel account, Jesus says, "By your perseverance you will secure your lives."

Perseverance...we all need that! I know there are a good number of people who persevere just to get through the day. For some, it is because of health situations. Others, all the necessary work connected with family and home. Others, trying to "keep up with the Jones's." Still others, overwhelmed with what is happening in our communities, countries, and world. Where to we find relief and peace?

One of the many gifts of the Church gathering together Sunday after Sunday, following the command of Jesus, is that we pray together for each other and then unite all of our wishes, desires, hopes, and dreams to God through the offering of Jesus Christ. We look across the pews of the church and know others are experiencing similar situations in life. Someone else just got jarring physical news or lost a job. Someone else just lost a loved one. Someone else is in a struggling marriage or relationship. Someone else is...(fill in the blank). As we come to pray for and with one another, we are strengthened in our perseverance. We are strengthened not only in our common prayer for one another but especially in receiving the Word of God proclaimed and His Body and Blood in Holy Communion.

During the past years as we endured the pandemic, we found ourselves isolated. Yet, God created us to be in a community with one another, just as Father, Son, and Holy Spirit are in a community with each other. As the Sunday community gathers and prays for us, we have a duty to do the same. Yes, I know there are many distractions in our world for our families. Nonetheless, if are going to truly persevere in our life and in our faith, and be saved and secure our eternal life, a priority on (weekends) Sunday has to be God first, joining a community that needs us, loves us, and prays for us. Perseverance takes away our fears because we know we are securely in the Lord's hands.

More about him next week but know his wide range experience in the Church's music ministry will enhance our prayer and liturgical life here at Star of the Sea.


** Please pray for those who will be experiencing the Sacrament of Reconciliaton for the first time this Thursday. May the love and mercy of God continue to grow in their heart.

The Walking with Moms in Need initiative partners with the Archdiocese of Detroit to equip and assist Catholic parishes and parishioners in raising awareness about resources that aid pregnant and parenting moms in need. Senior volunteer opportunities are offered through the Retired and Senior Volunteer Program (R.S.V.P.), and the Senior Outreach Program helps low-income and disabled homebound seniors age in place with dignity, delivering perishable groceries and personal necessities to their homes. In development now, The Residences at St. Matthew in Detroit will provide permanent supportive and affordable housing to those in need.

In St. Luke's Gospel, Jesus speaks of natural disasters, including earthquakes, famines, and plagues, as well as wars, and even persecutions, before His second coming. Deepening our discipleship in Christ leads to a personal relationship with Him and fortifies and strengthens us. Pray daily and attend Mass frequently to partake in the Eucharist for Christ's strength during difficult times. As Jesus states: By your perseverance, you will secure your lives.






Saints Peter and Paul

A Prayer for Spiritual Communion
