Happy Advent! Happy New (Liturgical) Year!

Here we are at the start of Advent again. Maybe this year we can settle down a bit and focus on the real nature of the season. We are preparing for the Lord! Our first preparation must deal with this space and time, a month before we celebrate Christmas. The second preparation must deal the coming of the Lord at the end of all time.

I think more than some previous years, people are seeking the warmth, hope, comfort, and festivity that we find in the holiday season. As write this article (10 days before Thanksgiving due to printing deadlines) I already see Christmas lights lit outside people's home and even a few trees up inside. We seek warmth, hope, togetherness, and joy as we continue to struggle with the isolation and self-centeredness of the pandemic. We need something to lift our spirits. Advent, and the hope it brings, can be some of the medicine we need!

Our theme this year is ... Advent: In the Heart of Mary-The Habit of Advent. I think during the past few years we have gotten out of the habit and traditions of our life. Advent is a wonderful season when we stop a bit, be open to what the Lord wants from us (as Mary had to reflect on this very issue), be more aware of what is hidden in our life and how it can transform us. Be mindful of the Lord's presence within us, as Mary was!

Advent is the time to *prepare* for Christmas. (Remember the "Christmas season" does not end Dec. 25 but only begins Dec. 25.) We see the days get shorter and the darkness of the night starts sooner. With Christmas, the days get longer and brighter – just as the presence of Christ sheds light in our life. Even as we might put up the tree and decorations around the house, and as we light up the outside of our homes, let us be mindful how we are preparing for Christmas. Say little prayers as you decorate that the spirit of peace of Christmas will permeate your heart and enliven your spirit to celebrate the true meaning of Christmas. As you put up the Nativity set in your house, maybe leave the infant out of the manger until Christmas Day. Focus on those people most special in your life and treasure the gift they are to you. Let Advent be Advent and rejoice with the arrival of Christmas!



#### "O Come Let Us Adore Him"

"Without prolonged moments of adoration, of prayerful encounter with the word, of sincere conversation with

the Lord, our work easily becomes meaningless; we lose energy as a result of weariness and difficulties, and our fervor dies out. The Church urgently needs the deep breath of prayer, and to my great joy groups devoted to prayer and intercession, the prayerful reading of God's word and the perpetual adoration of the Eucharist are growing at every level of ecclesial life." (From Pope Francis's first apostolic exhortation "Evangelii Gaudium," 262)

Spend an hour per week in the Eucharistic Presence of Our Lord by your own personal commitment of the day and the hour.

#### **Living Under the Influence**

"We ought to let everything grow in us, as Christ grew in Mary. And we ought to realize that in everything that does grow quietly in us, Christ grows. We should let thoughts and words and songs grow slowly and unfold in darkness in us." - Houselander, Caryll. The Reed of God (p. 53).

In her book, *The Reed of God*, Caryll inspired a renewed appreciation in me for the Season of Advent, Our Holy Mother and living my faith. She sees Advent in the heart of Mary as a living process whereby God enters our life and grows within us in a hidden, mysterious, and transformative way. She maintains that God's way begins with an event and then slowly unfolds in the darkness until a new beginning emerges. We see this particularly in Mary as she receives the invitation to become the Mother of God at the Annunciation, and then carries this new life within her allowing the encounter to transform her as Jesus transforms within her. This transformation is hidden and slow, like a seed planted with tremendous anticipation of a bountiful harvest of fruit and beauty in the future.

Life is filled with such encounters. We often experience news, a shift in life that is perhaps unexpected or even thrust upon us, that sets into motion a slow hidden process that changes us. As we move towards Advent, I'd like to explore this idea more deeply together. I'd like to reclaim Advent in my life, and appreciate how God proposes change and grows in me and how I can embrace this encounter in a way that is life giving and part of the process of being a beloved son or daughter of God.

Advent Family Night is December 6 at 6:30p. Save the date! That night we will have time together to explore and share in this sacred process of Advent together! I really hope you can make it. I'll say more in the coming weeks.







Greetings new friends. I'd like to introduce myself to you and share a bit about the fellow you'll see at the piano and organ from here on out. My name is Aaron Kaleniecki – I've been a Minister of Music in the AOD for about 25 years. I've played in a number of parishes spanning the reaches of the Archdiocese. Most recently, I was at St. Patrick in White Lake for almost 8 years. Prior to that, St. Joseph in South Lyon. Before moving out to the western suburbs, I worked downtown at St. Aloysius on Washington Blvd, and before that, Holy Redeemer in Southwest Detroit. There are a few others however the furthest east I had traveled prior to my arrival here – was in 2001-2002 when my wife Ruth and I shared a music position at neighboring St. Clare of Montefalco.

Our family of 4 including our two sons Ralph and Charles, live in Allen Park. The boys are very engaged in music and athletics at St. Francis Cabrini – however expect to see much of them around.

As a musician, I tend to be very "middle of the road." I enjoy classical and traditional sacred music as much as I enjoy Rock n Roll. I dabble in rock and blues organ playing, and love playing electric guitar in my free time. We are a musical family, with Ruth being a fine vocalist, and both boys advancing as guitarists.

Outside of music, my hobbies include restoring vintage/classic cars, old blues and rock organs, and tube audio equipment from the 50s and 60s. We own a handful of classic cars that I've restored over the last 20 years, and do drive them regularly. I've become a bit of an "internet celebrity" with a few videos of my cars and technical articles that I've written for some of the internet forums – I could go on for days talking about this so if vintage cars interest you – please chat with me. As for the audio stuff, I've been learning and restoring old tube audio equipment and try to spend as much time listening to it as I did restoring it – sadly that doesn't often happen.

In my spare time (ha ha) I operate a small digital organ company that sells and coordinates the installation of modern digital church organs. It has helped me learn many things about the organ (outside of simply playing it) as well as the different styles of music, worship, and all things related to sacred music including the ins and outs of large space amplified sound systems.

Nevertheless, most people find me to be an interesting individual to talk with and I hope over the next few months, we all get the chance to chat some as learn about the parish.

I can't tell you how thrilled I am to be here and look forward to a long tenure of making music with you here at Star.
