Archdiocesan law requires advance notice of at least six months.

Newcomers to the parish may register in the Parish Office during regular office hours. Others, please notify the Parish Office of address changes. **Adults over 21** need to be registered as an individual member to be considered a Catholic in Good Standing.

Hearing devices are available for use during Mass. Please ask an usher for assistance.



Next weekend is the annual appeal for the Retirement Fund for Religious. As I think you are aware, our religious have, for so many years, served the Church at great sacrifice to themselves and their religious communities to the benefit of the institutions and people they served. Now, the vast majority of religious orders have many more retired and infirmed in their order than those "out in the field" of

ministry. Most of us probably have been beneficiaries of their services in some way or another. Their service or ministry today is equally significant. They all need our help. In the midst of all the other charities asking, your generosity is very much appreciated by all the retired religious orders of sisters, brothers and priests. (Retired Diocesan priests are not included in this collection.)

** **Monday night** you are invited to spend some time before our Eucharistic Lord during our monthly **Holy Hour**, beginning at 7:30 pm. These holy hours are a combination of readings, music, prayer and a good dose of quiet so the Lord can really speak to us. Advent is a prime opportunity to spend some quiet time with the Lord in the midst of all the business!

** **Tuesday** night at 6:30 is our Parish Advent Night. See the flyer elsewhere in this bulletin but know it will be a good time for one and all of all ages.

** Tuesday is also the feast of St. Nicholas. St. Nicholas lived and was a bishop in the late third century is what we know today to be Turkey. He shared his resources through his generosity of anonymous gifts through the land, especially to those in need. This tradition if the foundation of that great guy from the North Pole! St. Nick is the patron saint of children. So on Monday night remember to put out a shoe, or have your children put out a shoe, and see if St; Nick will leave some treats if they are good or some coal if the need improvement in the "good category."

** Wednesday will have private confessions in the church from 6:30 pm - 7:30 pm.

** **Thursday is a Holyday of Obligation**, the *Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary*. The Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception is the patronal feast day for our country.

The Holydays of the Church are significant solemnities or feasts celebrating certain mysteries of the Lord, our Blessed Mother or the Saints that are to be celebrated by all the people. They still have their purpose of drawing us together into the one Body of Christ. Please take the time to observe the Holydays of Obligation. This Thursday we have Mass at 7:30 am, 10 am and 7:00 pm.

"Has the tender love of a father or the liberality of a king toward its subjects ever reached as far as the

love of Jesus Christ in the Blessed Sacrament?" (St. John Vianney). Jesus, may all nations declare Thee God and King; may they fall on their knees before Thee! May they throw down their vice, open their hearts, and lift up their souls to adore Thee!

Spend an hour per week in the Eucharistic Presence of Our Lord by your own personal commitment of the day and the hour. Our Lord cannot be outdone in generosity when we give to Him of ourselves in prayer.

Living Under the Influence

In planning a night to gather as a parish family during Advent, all I really think about is your heart. In prayer, I wonder what you might be experiencing today, or what impact the last few years of lockdowns, precautions or fears may have had. I wonder about where you are in your relationship to God and if any faith has been shaken? Have any doubts or distance occurred? Then, how can we gather and take one step closer towards the hope and security that is our Lord. Now, Msgr. Garv would probably appreciate it if I paid a little more attention to some logistics, but he's so good at that that I'm just going to keep praying into all of you.

I see this night not as an event to attend like a play, but more like a liturgy in which to engage. It is simple, humble, and joyful. It should inspire and remind us of what we need to hear. Advent is an amazing process in the journey of faith. Let's rediscover this together, maybe just a little bit, and strengthen each other in our identity as Catholics and family here at this little parish. In preparation and meditation for Family Advent Night (and Advent in general), I'd like to offer a few more quotes from Caryll Houselander's book The Reed of God to provide a deeper glimpse into what Advent can signify for vou.

"Advent is the season of the secret, the secret of the growth of Christ, of Divine Love growing in silence."

"It is the season of humility, silence, and growth. For nine months Christ grew in His Mother's body. By His own will she formed Him from herself, from the simplicity of her daily life. She had nothing to give Him but herself. He asked for nothing else. She gave Him herself. Working, eating, sleeping, she was forming His body from hers. His flesh and blood. From her humanity she gave Him His humanity."

"By His own will Christ was dependent on Mary during Advent: He was absolutely helpless; He could go nowhere but where she chose to take Him; He could not speak; her breathing was His breath; His heartbeat in the beating of her heart."

"This time of Advent is absolutely essential to our contemplation too. If we have truly given our humanity to be changed into Christ, it is essential to us that we do not disturb this time of growth."

I hope to see you on the 6th!


Our Sunday Coffee & Donut Ministry has returned!!

Plan to stop in on one of the following Sundays:


