Forty years certainly goes by fast!! I know I have been very blessed in my vocation. I remember back in second grade drawing a picture of a priest when the teacher said to draw what we want to do when we grow up. When I began serving in 5th or 6th grade I knew this was something I enjoyed, even at the 6:15 am weekday Mass! It was in 6th or 7th grade I was starting to be the one to set things up for major celebrations and act as the master of ceremonies at

certain Masses (something that has continued to this day). The call to service was certainly enforced when I was chosen to be one of two "office boys" in eighth grade. I had responsibilities before, during, and after school, assisting the principal that interacted with the faculty. High school also reinforced serving the Church in various ways. It was my junior year that I seriously felt the call to enter the seminary and see where the Lord was calling. Throughout all those years of formation, as I continued to serve my home parish of Our Lady of Good Counsel (by the city airport, now closed), I continued to feel happy and fulfilled in what I was doing, which was reaffirmed by the people I was ministering with and to. Eight years of seminary formation was good and enlightening on the path to priesthood.

December 11, 1982 was certainly a joy filled day. It was obviously was not the conclusion of formation but only the beginning. My home parish of OLGC formed me over the years in one way and then my internship at St. Martin de Porres in other ways specific to ministry. Certainly you come to realize with every pastoral assignment, the Holy Spirit continues to form us in new ways by a new community and new colleagues in the ministry. That has certainly been true for me through my ministry at St. Angela in Roseville, Divine Child in Dearborn, the extra graduate studies at The Catholic University of America, being on the formation team and faculty at Sacred Heart Major Seminary, pastor of St. Thecla, and certainly here at Our Lady Star of the Sea. In each assignment the Holy Spirit continued to call me to serve the Church in many ways, certainly not the ways I ever thought about when in seminary formation more than 40 years ago.

I have been blessed in bringing the sacraments of the Church to God's people in each parish assignment. Certainly my time forming men for the priesthood, and lay people pursuing other academic certificates and ministry degrees, at Sacred Heart Major Seminary, was an exceptional privilege. I am very happy that the seminary Liturgy and Homiletics Laboratory I formed in the early 1990's is still instrumental in clergy formation today. I am ever thankful to Cardinal Szoka who ordained me and later sent me to CUA for the special liturgical degree which has only enabled me to further serve the broader Church of Detroit, and beyond, in so many different ways.

My years of priestly service have been a time of an abundant blessings because of God's action in the people of God. I am still being formed today by God's people and pray that I am still forming others, drawing them closer to God in their own call of service and sainthood. May God continue to bless all of us and strengthen us to live our life putting God as a priority so we may bring forth His Kingdom and inherit eternal life.
