There is a legend that the song was written during the 16th century when the Church of England forbade all religious teachings not in alignment with theirs. So, the song disguises the true meaning behind it so the people could teach their children in secret. Each of the items in the song represents something of religious significance. The "true love" in the song represents God who is the giver of all gifts



The "partridge in a pear tree" was the greatest gift of all: Christ dying on a cross, made from a tree.



The "Two turtle doves" were the Old and New Testaments.



The "three French hens" are faith, hope, and Charity the Theological Virtues



The "four calling birds" are a symbol of the four Gospels which sing the song of salvation through Jesus Christ



The "five golden rings" represent the first five books of the Old Testament—which gives the history of man's fall from grace.



The "six geese a-laying" symbolizes the six days of creation.



The 'seven swans a swimming" were the seven gifts of the Holy Spirit and the seven sacraments.



The "eight maids of milking" are the eight beatitudes.



The "nine ladies dancing" are nine fruits of the Holy Spirit.



The "ten Lords—leaping" represent the Ten Commandments.



The "eleven pipers piping" symbolizes the eleven faithful disciples.



The "twelve drummers drumming" are the twelve points of the Apostles" Creed.

Tax Advantaged Ways to Give to Our Parish

Parishioners may consider these two tax-advantaged ways to make charitable gifts to our parish at the year end.

Gifts of Appreciated Securities

Gifts of appreciated securities continue to be beneficial for donors since they offer significant tax advantages including income tax deductions and avoidance of tax on capital gains if the donor were to sell the highly appreciated securities. Through a gift of appreciated securities to benefit our parish, including to the Catholic Services Appeal, parishioners who itemize may receive an income tax deduction up to the full market value of the securities and can also avoid capital gains tax on the appreciation. In essence, you may save twice—on income tax and capital gains tax.

IRA Rollover -- Qualified Charitable Distribution

The IRA qualified charitable distribution (QCD) provides a way for donors 70 ½ and older to receive a tax benefit for their generosity. It is beneficial because the QCD will not be included in adjusted gross income and is therefore not subject to tax. This is now more beneficial in view of the increased standard deduction in the new tax law. A donor can make a QCD of up to \$100,000 annually directly from the IRA to a charity, and as an added benefit, if the donor is age 72, the QCD satisfies the donor's required minimum distribution. Parishioners 70 ½ or older should consult with their IRA administrator for the procedure to make a QCD to our parish.

Do you read aloud well? We'd love for you to share your gift for reading aloud with us by proclaiming the Word during Mass.


Our lectors find that participation in the Lector Ministry gives them an increased understanding of and appreciation for Sacred Scripture.
