Happy Advent! Happy New (Liturgical) Year! There is always a lot of excitement this time of the year. There is the planning, the shopping, the baking, the different activities, and gatherings. Hopefully, in the midst of it all, we can still remember the priorities and reason of the season. Our Advent theme this year is, "O come let us adore him." [This is our focus Tuesday Advent Family Night.]

This year, Advent consists of three full weeks and then one day, which is also Christmas Eve. Last year we had four full weeks of Advent. So, we have much less time this Advent than last year. Nonetheless, it can still be very profitable for us as we put our mind and soul into the right focus.

Let's try to celebrate the season of Advent this year, even as we naturally combine and blend it with the season of Christmas. Advent is the time to *prepare* for Christmas. We see the days get shorter and the darkness of the night starts sooner. With Christmas, the days get longer and brighter – just as the presence of Christ sheds light in our life. Even as we might put up the tree and decorations around the house, and as we light up the outside of our homes, let us be mindful how we are preparing for the Christmas season that begins Dec. 25.

Definitions of "adore" mention: "great love," "regard with the utmost esteem," "love intensely," etc. What do we adore? Sometime people say they adore a particular thing, an inanimate object. Others, of course, adore a person. When we encounter a person we adore, relish the time that is special, often being speechless, and want the clock to stop in order for the moment to last a long time.

Michael King, in his article last week, asked the question, does Jesus adore you? "Is he adoring you right now and perhaps you are just not aware?" According to various definitions, I believe Jesus does "adore" us, loving us very intensely, and that is why he died for us. Do you adore Jesus??

Another place we encounter Jesus and naturally adore him is at the celebration of Holy Mass. Often, we use the word "adore" or "adoration" in reference to the Blessed Sacrament, the Presence of Jesus Christ, soul and divinity, in the consecrated host. You are invited weekly to come and spend time in "adoration" before the Blessed Sacrament. That is a great place to start, to come and adore him, sitting quietly and opening your heart to Jesus. This Advent, I ask you to reflect how you adore Jesus at Mass? Or how do you not adore him? Do you marvel at the mystery of the Eucharist, the gift Jesus has given to us, the gift we receive in Holy Communion and rightfully should stop us in our tracks? Or do we take the Eucharist as simply another object given to us? This Advent, I challenge each of us to first "adore" Jesus in Holy Communion. Don't take Holy Communion and then walk out of church like our routine at a drive-thru or convenience store. Jesus adores you deeply. How do you respond in return?

As you prepare your soul, your heart, your home this Advent, pause from the rush throughout the day and spend time adoring God. See in the "things" of the season the many expressions of God's majesty and love.

** This first week of Advent is packed with wonderful activities. Monday night: our

Advent Holy Hour with the Blessed Sacrament. Tuesday night: our Parish Advent night for one and all, the family of Star of the Sea. A time to be social, to pray, to listen, to sing, and then to light up our Christmas Star! Thursday is our school Christmas Concert. Friday is a Holy day of Obligation, the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception. Saturday the Langsford Men's Chorus Christmas Concert is here. Sunday, is the K of C St. Nicholas Pancake Breakfast and the Grosse Pointe Symphony has their holiday concert here, with a special feature of Aaron on the organ, and me once again narrating Prokofiev's famous, "Peter and the Wolf."

Living Under the Influence

Adoring and Presence

Our parish **Advent Family Night** is this Tuesday, Dec. 5th at 6:30p. Are you going to be there?

Here is one reason to come: A chance to adore and allow God to speak to you. What do I mean? This year, as I mentioned in last week's bulletin, our parish family will have as a theme "O come let us adore him" to use as a focus point to develop our faith. One aspect of adoration is presence or being present to another. So how does one practice or engage in being present? I recommend three steps:

Prep - Before you come on Tuesday, take a few moments to quiet yourself, and then speak to God and ask him to show himself to you during the evening and ask for the grace to notice it when it happens. Then, close your short little prayer with giving thanks to God.

Be alert – Enter the event and have fun! Eat, drink, laugh, and spend time with someone or as many people as you can. Perhaps, meet someone new. While you are doing this be mindful of the conversations and experiences you are having. Know that you are with your faith family with God at the center of everything that is happening.

Reflect - Sometime after the event, take several moments to reflect on what happened, who you spent time with and what was said. Review the evening. Consider where was God hidden? Where was God present? How did God communicate to you? God often communicates through thoughts, feelings, or perhaps something even more.

If you do this, you have taken one step into deeper adoration, of being present to your inner self, of those around you and of God. God's love is abundant, and he "speaks" through all creation and events, and significantly he speaks in and through you.

Stewardship Thoughts

Today's Scripture passages express the Advent topics of hope, vigilance, and repentance. From the Book of Isaiah, the prophet expresses his desire for his people (the ancient Israelites who have returned from Babylonian exile) to atone for their sinful ways and turn their hearts back to the Lord. For God has done great deeds for them. In St. Mark's Gospel, the evangelist quotes Jesus' warning to His disciples, *Be watchful! Be alert! You do not know when the time will come.* Here our Lord and Savior is referring to when He will return at the end of time. St. Paul reminds the Corinthians, and us, that our fellowship in the Lord fortifies us with many spiritual gifts — a timely reminder as we start this Advent season. May we, as faith-filled stewards, put our hope and trust in the Lord, recognize our sins, and seek with contrite hearts, Jesus' mercy and forgiveness. Advent is an excellent time to confess our sins by taking part in the Sacrament of Reconciliation.
