It is not easy for the priests and ministers either!! Seven Masses and two different celebrations to cover in 3 days! **Please note that there is no 9:30 and 11:30 am Masses next Sunday, Dec. 24.** Knowing the challenges of the weekend, we will do our best to make the Masses for the 4th Sunday of Advent a little bit simpler and shorter!

** Please remember that church will be crowded next Sunday afternoon. Despite the crowds, invite others to join us here at Star for our Christmas liturgies. It is wonderful to see so many people here who are friends or family of parishioners. Patience, consideration and hospitality are always good virtues to practice, especially as so many gather to celebrate these holy days.

** Please note: after 3:30 pm people will no longer be able to save seats in the church in consideration of the people who are coming in to the church. Also note there is no 4:15 Mass in the gym. The past few years has been a decrease in attendance and last year the people in the gym could have been accommodated in the church.

** Remember to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation (confession) this Advent. I have added an afternoon time (1-2 pm) for individual confession. May you be touched by the powerful presence of the Lord as we prepare and celebrate His coming!

Living Under the Influence

Why are we always repenting? Haven't we said sorry enough? And what does repentance and adoring have to do with each other? Well, let's take a look.

The color purple during the Advent Season reminds us that this is a time of repentance. But it's not quite the same focus as we discern and practice during the Season of Lent. Repentance during this season, if understood clearly, can change the whole way you see your faith and grow as a child of God. <u>The key</u> is in the interpretation of the word *repent* in scripture. It has several meanings, the most significant is a love relationship – What? Ok, let's hear this from Dr. David Torkington, who is an expert in the spiritual life. Dr. Torkington reminds us that St. Peter on Pentecost Day while announcing the Good News and God's love told his listeners to:

"keep turning and opening themselves to God's love every moment of their lives. Speaking to them in languages they could understand, he used the word 'repent'. In Hebrew there is no such word for someone who has repented, but only for someone who is repenting. It is a continuous ongoing process that pertains to the very essence of the Christian life. This repenting or this turning and opening oneself to receive the love of God has to be learnt, and the place where it is learnt has traditionally been called prayer. That is why there is nothing more important in our lives than prayer, because without it we cannot receive the only love that can make us sufficiently perfect to enter into the life of the Three in One to which we have been called. That is why St Teresa of Avila said, "There is only one way to perfection and that is to pray; if anyone points in another direction then they are deceiving you." There is nothing therefore more important than prayer." -Torkington, David. Prayer Made Simple.

The ongoing "repentance" is a way of being Christian because it is an ongoing turning of our heart to God, away from the trappings of the world and interior turmoil to the outpouring of God's love in us. This transformation takes time and must be practiced. This type Living Under the Influence continued of praying is at the heart of adoration. See, repentance it's not necessarily about our sin as failure, but sin as an opportunity to aid in the training of our will and heart to always turn to our loving God until we are fully saturated in the love of God and become saints. So, repent, and come let us adore him!

How would distractions in prayer relate to this ongoing interior change and adoring? Well, I'll address that next week.
