



Living Under the Influence

Adoring and The Family

As I continue this series on adoring, I'd like to consider the significance of the family on this Feast of the Holy Family.

Marriage and family is perhaps the most significant sacrament next to the Eucharist. It is the first of all the other sacraments and reflects the very essence of the Holy Trinity. In fact, marriage is the earthly witness to the Holy Trinity. One could say that to see holy matrimony is to glimpse God in action. St. Pope John Paul II reminds us of how critically significant holy matrimony is and why the vocation should be respected and lived at such a high level. He said:

"The family is the domestic church. The meaning of this traditional Christian idea is that the home is the Church in miniature. The Church is the sacrament of God's love. She is a communion of faith and life. She is a mother and teacher. She is at the service of the whole human family as it goes forward towards its ultimate destiny. In the same way the family is a community of life and love. It educates and leads its members to their full human maturity, and it serves the good of all along the road of life. The family is the "first and vital cell of society". In its own way it is a living image and historical representation of the mystery of the Church. The future of the world and of the Church, therefore, passes through the family. ... As the family goes, so goes the nation, and so goes the whole world in which we live."

The family is so critical to the Church that the Church looks to the family to fully understand herself:

"The sacrament of matrimony witnesses to and strengthens the Church: "Spouses are therefore the permanent reminder to the Church of what happened on the Cross; they are for one another and for the children witnesses to the salvation in which the sacrament makes them sharers" (Familiaris Consortio,13). This marital witness is so significant for the Church she can admit "so that the Church, in order fully to understand her mystery, looks to the Christian family, which manifests her in a real way" (Instrumentum Laboris, 4).

The love in the family is where we begin to learn the true meaning of adoring and adoration. It is through the Holy Family that we witness this at the highest level, and are given the example and invitation to become like them, because we can. This Christmas season take time to adore at the nativity scene. Take the scene into prayer, then take the love in that scene into your live, into your family and into your neighbor. If you do this, then we truly will be living our vocation to marriage and family.

Stewardship Thoughts

The topic of family links today's Scripture passages. The reading from Sirach instructs us: Whoever honors his father atones for sins, and those who respect their mother store up riches. Those who care for elderly parents are not forgotten, and their kindness is firmly planted as an offering against sin. In St. Luke's Gospel, the evangelist retells of Joseph and Mary's presentation of Jesus to the Lord in the Jerusalem Temple. This is done in accordance with Mosaic Law. Jesus, Mary, and Joseph then return to Nazareth, where our Lord grows in strength and wisdom. In St. Paul's Letter to the Colossian community, he emphasizes bearing with one another and forgiving one another... as the Lord has forgiven you. Christ's peace must reign in our families' hearts. As Pope St. John Paul II pointed out, the family is the "Domestic Church." Vocations are born and nurtured in families that embrace the Catholic faith by making Jesus the center of their lives. May we, as Christian stewards, continue to strive, build, and pray for solid Christian families in an increasingly antifamily attitude found today in secular society. To strengthen your family, make time daily to pray and eat at least one meal together. Most important, attend Sunday Mass weekly as a family and partake of Holy Communion.
