Happy Epiphany!

Our celebration of the Magi coming to see the newborn King should also remind us of our own need to come before the Lord to offer homage and praise. We each come before the Lord with the many gifts God has bestowed upon us. We might not have gold, frankincense and myrrh, but we have faith, a free will, and the love of God. We might also have a sense of humor, intelligence,

compassion, a listening ear and heart, insight, wisdom, physical skills, athletic skills, musical ability, etc., etc., etc.. We all have many God given gifts that we first must offer thanks to God and then use in the service of others for the sake and good of others.

There is a custom of blessing homes on this day or during this week. Over your door frame, in chalk, you would put 20 + C + M + B + 24. This is the new year we are in with the first initials of the three traditional names of the three kings, Caspar, Melchior and Balthasar.

I pray that during this year we will continue to grow in our love of all people as sisters and brothers in the Lord. May this year bring all of us closer to the Lord and to each other. There are so many gifts from God that still need to be discovered and used for the sake of the Kingdom of God. May the Light of Christ continue to shine bright in the hearts of all Our Lady Star of the Sea Parishioners as we journey together to the Kingdom.

** Monday we celebrate the Baptism of the Lord, Usually this is celebrated on Sunday, but with Christmas and New Year's day being on Mondays and Epiphany on Sunday, the Baptism gets transferred to Monday, bringing to a close the Christmas Season.

As we celebrate the baptism of the Lord, we once again recognize that our faith is rooted in our own "baptism in the Lord." This should be the core from which everything we are, do and say emanates. We have died with Christ in the waters of baptism and have been called to take on his life of service and love in all that we do. Do we??

As I often explain at baptisms, everything goes back to our baptism and our place of baptism. Everything that we are called to be, by God, goes back to our incorporation into the family of God through our baptism, becoming his daughter or son. Everything we do as a Christian flows from our baptism as we are called to be the Light of Christ to others and take on the image of Jesus and His dying and rising in our life. Baptism is a glorious day in the life of the one being baptized!

For the parents of the young one being baptized, it is a foundational day for them as well. They are making life changing promises to God regarding their child. They are asked, "... you are undertaking the responsibility of raising them in the faith, so that, keeping God's commandments, they may love the Lord and their neighbor as Christ has taught us. Do you understand this responsibility?" They are also making a promise to raise the child in the practice of their Catholic faith and religion, being the first teachers of the faith! Of course, being a teacher of the faith is to model the practice of the faith in all aspects of life. With the Grace of God, parents are able to do just that!

Many people also do not realize that, for Catholics, all of our significant religious events are recorded at our place of baptism. Each parish has a big book to record every baptism. Each person has their own line that includes the names of the parents and God parents, date and city of birth and date of baptism, the person baptizing, and then also the dates of First Communion, Confirmation as well as the sacraments of Matrimony and Holy Orders also get noted. Parishes are required to inform the church of baptism for all those sacraments a person receives. This process helps to ensure the accuracy of statements of sacramental reception. It is a standard procedure but when you are asked to do such, please do so more than a few hours before you need it!

Just a word of clarification about the role of Godparents. Often people think of them as

those who will assume the legal responsibility of the child if something happens to the parents. That is NOT the role of Godparents. Godparents, one male and one female by Canon Law, help the parents in providing the formation of the Catholic faith of the person being baptized. That is something that should be taken seriously and not just picking the next person in the family line. Hence, logically, you cannot pick a Jewish friend or a non-Catholic as "Godparents." When it comes to the Sacrament of Baptism, a person must have at least one person who is Catholic that will assume the role of a Godparent. (A person cannot have more than two Godparents. If, for some reason parents insist that there has to be more than two, only two will be recorded in the Baptismal Register.) A Godparent must be at least 16 years of age and fully initiated into the Catholic Church. A person who is a non-Catholic Christian would be recorded as a "Christian witness." (For more information go to our website under the Sacrament of Baptism.)

During the celebration of baptism, the Godparents themselves are asked three times if they are willing and able to assume the responsibilities of raising the child in the Catholic faith. Hence, it is an important lifetime responsibility regarding the faith!

This week let us reflect on the importance of our own baptism and how we are living out our own baptismal promises, or those made when we presented our children to be baptized. Think of the significance of that baptism in your life as a christian or disciple of Jesus. How is your life lived out so that others know, without a doubt, that you are a baptized christian or Catholic?

- ** As we bring to a close the Christmas season, let us continue to hold each other in prayer and keep alive the love, peace and gentleness brought to us through the Christ Child!
- ** May the Peace and Love of the Holy Family and the wonder and awe of the Three Kings be yours!

Music Ministry Epiphany Concert Sunday, January 7th, 4:00pm

Join us in closing out the Christmas Season with a musical journey through the story of the birth of Jesus including selections from Handel's Messiah, as well as works by John Rutter, Matt Maher, Chris Tomlin, and other contemporary Christian Composers. The program will feature the Star Choir, Caritas, and Soloists as well as a Carol Sing-A-long.



Today, in St. Matthew's Gospel, the evangelist retells the story of the Magi visiting the Christ-child, the newborn King. In this initial meeting, they are overwhelmed, and in response, venerate our Lord by prostrating themselves, face down. The Magi open their treasures and offer Jesus gold, frankincense, and myrrh. These gifts foreshadow Christ's royalty, divinity, and suffering. The Scripture passages from Isaiah and St. Paul further convey that the Good News of salvation is to be proclaimed to all people. Do we, as faithful stewards strive to follow the Magi's example of offering adoration, praise, and glory to God? Do we, in thanksgiving, embrace the Good News, deepening our personal relationship in Christ? Then, in turn, spread His joy, peace, and message of hope and salvation to all those we meet? To encounter Christ, plan to attend Alpha or a similar evangelization event offered at your parish.



Living Under the Influence

Adoring and Seeing God

Do you see what the Magi saw? As I conclude this series on adoration within the context of Advent and the Christmas Season, I'd like to draw attention to Joy, and encourage you to see it. This amazing Joy is manifested through our God who keeps his word and includes us in his joy.

How can we see what the magi saw? Perhaps we should follow their example. First, we have to notice a desire within for something more. Then, we must go on the journey to seek it no matter the cost. Lastly, we have to actually see him before we can adore him. My challenge to you is that you do the same. If you're reading this then you're already in a small caravan of people whom the Lord is calling into deeper communion, take him up on the challenge! Here's one way: Make a special time in prayer this week, stir up the desire to encounter God, allow a journey towards Christ to happen in your prayer by simply following the light of the Spirit (through Sacred Scripture) to lead you into an encounter worthy of adoration. Then adore him. Just let your heart flow with love and see what happens!

Practical how-to

Start with today's readings. Today's first reading, psalm and second reading provide the path. Simply hear the word, make the connection to your life, and allow the Spirit to lead you to Jesus. Take time with the following questions and explore for yourself. Allow the Holy Spirit to provide insight and connection.

Example

First reading: "Rise up in splendor, Jerusalem! Your light has come, the glory of the Lord shines upon you. See, darkness covers the earth, and thick clouds cover the peoples; but upon you the LORD shines, and over you appears his glory."

Ask: Who is Jerusalem then and today? Today it is the Church, it is you! Where do you notice "darkness covers the earth, and thick clouds cover the peoples"? Is this happening in your family, in your life, in our country, in our Church? Ah, but the Lord has come, he has broken through, the "Lord shines and over you appears his glory!" The Lord has conquered death. He is life and truth, where all other cultural noise and pain can be tuned out and we can place our trust, complete trust in him. Why? LOOK what he did and is doing! He is so real that he is with us in the Eucharist! Nothing can stop him.

Second reading: Paul, writing then to the people of Ephesus, is now writing personally to you. Read it that way. Replace "brothers and sisters" with your name and allow Paul to tell you of a great revelation that was kept hidden by God so that in the proper time God could give you this great gift. And what is this gift? The gift is that you have been chosen to receive all that God has. It is all for you. Paul says "You have heard of the stewardship of God's grace that was given to me for your benefit, namely, that the mystery was made known to me by revelation. It was not made known to people in other

generations as it has now been revealed to his holy apostles and prophets by the Spirit: that the Gentiles (you) are coheirs, members of the same body, and copartners in the promise in Christ Jesus through the gospel." You are in the royal family. You are an heir to all the treasure of heaven. God sent his only son to die so that this gift could be yours. You have won the greatest of life's lotteries and you didn't even have the money to buy the ticket.

All of this, and so much more is what drove the magi to seek, to journey for the new king. A king unlike any other, that they had to see for themselves. When they realized this was not just a story, not just myth or some false hope, when they finally arrived, "they saw the child with Mary his mother. They prostrated themselves and did him homage." I imagine their greatest gift was their tears of joy, wonder and awe, hearts full of gratitude and divine joy filling them as they were now family of the King. May your prayer journey and adoration end in the same joy.


