Today, February 11, is the Feast Day of Our Lady of Lourdes. On this day we recall a series of 18 appearances that the Blessed Virgin Mary made to a 14-year-old French peasant girl, Saint Bernadette Soubirous. It was there at Lourdes that Our Lady said, "I am the Immaculate Conception." Our Lady instructed Bernadette to dig in the ground nearby, from which came a spring with healing properties, active to this day. In more than 150 years of thousands of pilgrims visiting the

grotto at Lourdes each year, 70 miracles have been officially declared, after very thorough investigations, from the intervention of God through the intercession of Our Lady of Lourdes. Hundreds and hundreds of other miracles have taken place not officially declared by the Church.

Lourdes, in the southern part of France, has always been a pilgrimage destination for those who are sick, for people who need healing. Naturally, we think of people who have physical sickness or infirmities, e.g., cancer, terrible arthritis, unforgiving back pain, tumors, etc. However, people also go there for spiritual and psychological healing.

A few years ago I went to Lourdes "to work." After a visit the previous year as a pilgrim, I was made aware of a need that often exists there. There is usually a need for English speaking priests, who would like to assist the chaplain, to hear confessions for the thousands of pilgrims. (Confessions are heard in about 20 languages every day.). I was so fortunate to be chosen to minister there for 10 days. On many days I was available for 10 hours to hear confessions, preside at the daily English Mass. I was also blessed to be the English voice and priest for the huge evening candlelight procession and rosary, where thousands join in a beautiful hourlong procession of praying and singing.

I know from my time there that there is much more healing taking place through the Sacrament of Reconciliation than through the "bath" waters as Our Lady had directed. People leave healed psychologically and spiritually. They praise God for the new life and blessings in their life.

One this special feast day, please pray for all those who need God's special healing. We have been hearing in the scriptures the past weeks how people would follow Jesus from place to place, rushing to even touch the hem of his cloak and be healed. Offer to Jesus, by name, those who need the special healing touch of Jesus. It could be physical. It can certainly be spiritual. However, you know people who need healing, place them before the Lord through the intercession of Our Lady of Lourdes. Please also remember to pray for those special care givers! May the Lord give them patience, strength, encouragement, and the tenderness of Christ's heart! \*\* Well, it is here! I know... it is early...only because Easter is early! Yes, Ash Wednesday is this week! I encourage you to sign up for the I am here daily trivia challenge. Please see page 5 to sign up.

\*\* Speaking of ways to understand the Eucharist and the Mass, I invite you, those who are free on Thursday mornings, to come to church at 8:15am for a brief (15 minute) walk through the Mass. I chose this time so our school children can attend as well as those who are dropping off their child at our school, or any adult! Over the weeks of lent, we will divide up the Mass and explain what you see, what is happening, the actions, prayers, and elements of the Mass. Don't be ashamed that maybe you really don't know the Mass! This is the time to come and gain a better insight, for your understanding and then for you to pass on the information to others!

May this upcoming Lent be a blessed time of encountering the Lord in your life in new and uplifting ways!
