How is your lent going? Good? Not exactly fulfilling your lenten promises? Are you experiencing God's loving mercy? It is not too late to get back on track if you know you have been missing the mark!

Lent is one liturgical season that, thanks be to God, makes people think about going to confession, and rightfully so! It is good for us to get rid of our sins, do some interior "spring

cleaning" of the soul, get ourselves closer to the Lord in preparation for Easter. Parishes, in response to this stirring of the Holy Spirit within people to go to confession, usually add some additional times for people to experience God's abundant mercy through the sacrament of reconciliation,

This week there will be one additional opportunity for individuals and families to experience the Sacrament of Reconciliation in preparation for the Easter season. On Monday night, I will be in church from 6:30 -7:30 pm for private confessions. If you are more inclined to participate in a Penance Service (with individual confessions), there are two upcoming opportunities. <u>Next Wednesday</u>, March 20, at 1 pm at Our Lady of Hope Church (formerly known as St. Germaine). The following Monday, Monday of Holy Week, March 26, there will be another penance service with individual confessions at St. Joan of Arc church at 7 pm. In each of these celebrations we will pause to privately confess our sins, receive a penance and then receive absolution from the Church. So mark your calendars and don't miss the opportunities, behind the normal time here at Star on Saturday at 3 pm until all have been heard,

As we think about going to confessions, we pause and reflect on God's wonderful mercy that is generously given to us as we turn to Him, open our hearts and seek reconciliation for the sins we have committed in our life. (I know many people think they have not sinned...but I am only aware on perfect person in our history who did not sin and that was Jesus!) As we go through life we might forget some of the things that are sins. Increasingly people seem to forget that the Church still teaches that we are to participate in Mass every Sunday, barring physical disability or sickness. We are not asked to go just once a month, twice a month or whenever it fits our schedule outside the children's sports schedules or other activities. (With the schedules many people keep today it might never fit in!) Following the commandments, this needs to be a priority in our week so that we can be nourished by God's Word, and strengthened by His Body and Blood, in order to remain Christian in all we do and say throughout the week. Maybe we also forget that lying, stealing, cheating, gossiping, and swearing are also sins. So is the disrespect or unkind thoughts and actions that we show to all of God's creatures.

This is not the place to give a complete examination of conscience but I urge you to not only seriously think about the sins you have committed but most importantly the wonderful Grace you receive from God in the Sacraments. The Sacrament of Reconciliation gives us a chance to "wipe the slate clean" and be renewed by God's love. ** Please look at the upcoming schedule for Masses during Holy Week or the "Paschal

Tritium." These are the greatest Masses or liturgies of the whole year! If you have not experienced one before, maybe this year you can participate?

May the Lord continue to bless you and your family with peace in the faith of Christ!

Stewardship Thoughts

In his Gospel, St. John describes the common link in today's Scripture passages: God's infinite love for us — also a significant theme throughout the Bible. For God so loved the world that he gave His only Son, so that everyone who believes in Him might not perish but might have eternal life (John 3:16). The Second Book of Chronicles describes how God, following the Israelites' exile to Babylon due to grave sin, mercifully invites them home through an edict of King Cyrus of Persia. In St. Paul's Letter to the Ephesians. he reminds us of God's love and mercy through Christ even when we are dead in our transgressions. No sin is too great that it cannot be forgiven by our Lord through the Sacrament of Reconciliation. If you have not been to confession in a while, return with a contrite heart during Lent for forgiveness that will rekindle your discipleship in the Lord and give you peace.
