The Church strongly encourages people to receive the Sacrament (Anointing) of the Sick at the early stages of serious sickness or before serious surgeries.

In emergency situations needing the prompt attention of a priest, please call the parish office.

Archdiocesan law requires advance notice of at least six months.

Adults over 21 need to be registered as an individual member to be considered a Catholic in Good Standing.

Happy Easter! Can you imagine what it must have been like to be those apostles and followers of Christ? Put yourself in their shoes. For the past couple of years you have been through all the ups and downs with this man who has been your teacher, your mentor, your friend. You have seen him sought after by thousands of people to hear him or simply to see him pass by. You have seen the crowds bow down and laud him only to have those same people yell "crucify him." Then they did. All your hope and dreams seemed

lost. There was a definite darkness surrounding you. A huge void. Probably asking, "what has happened? Now what?" And then it happened. You hear the news that his tomb is empty with an angel reporting that He has been raised! What??? How can THIS be?

Then He rose from the dead, the clearest sign from God, to still show us the way to achieve eternal happiness. He loves us so much! His love is awesome!! He simply calls us to come to him, know him, listen to him, and trust in his way for us!

No matter where you are in your faith development, know one thing. God loves you, in your successes and failings. That is the bottom line of Easter. God loves you! Lift your heart. Open your spirit to Jesus and let him bring you joy and peace as you become his friend and follow him. Rejoice and be glad! This day is for you!!

Stewardship Thoughts

In the First Reading from the Acts of the Apostles, St. Peter recaps Jesus' mission: to release us from the devil's grip through His good works and sacrifice on the Cross and to send us forth as His missionary disciples to preach the Good News of salvation. In St. John's Gospel, Mary Magdalene arrives first at the empty tomb on that first Easter morning. She then prompts Peter and John to go there. Scripture tells us that upon their arrival, they discover the burial wrappings. St. John saw and believed. This is the beloved disciple who sat at Jesus' side at the Last Supper, who bravely stood at the foot of the Cross, who, at Jesus' request, took our Blessed Mother Mary as his mother, and, through his faith, was one of the first disciples to believe in the Risen Christ. St. Paul, in his letters, illustrates how Christ has been raised up, raising us along with Him. Like St. John, may the gift of Easter grace strengthen our faith and deepen our relationship with our Lord so we, too, may boldly profess, Jesus is risen. Alleluia! Christ invites us to make Him personal in our lives and commissioned to spread His Good News to everyone we meet. A good place to start is at Alpha or a similar evangelization course at your parish or a neighboring parish.
