

#### ANOINTING OF THE SICK/ MINISTRY TO THE SICK

The Church strongly encourages people to receive the Sacrament (Anointing) of the Sick at the early stages of serious sickness or before serious surgeries.

In emergency situations needing the prompt attention of a priest, please call the parish office.

#### MARRIAGE

#### Must be a registered member, in good standing, of OLSOS.

Archdiocesan law requires advance notice of at least six months.

#### **PARISH REGISTRATION**

Newcomers to the parish may register in the Parish Office or online at OLSOS.org. Please notify the Parish Office of address changes.

Adults over 21 need to be registered as an individual member to be considered a Catholic in Good Standing.

Hearing devices are available for use during Mass. Please ask an usher for assistance.



We are reminded in today's Gospel that Jesus is the vine and we are the branches. To bear fruit on the branch we have to be connected to the vine and keep those inner veins flowing with the nutrients that help to bring forth new life and produce. We see that in our gardens now (or hopefully soon) as we see new buds on our branches of trees and shrubs and plants. Soon it will be clear to us the branches we need to prune because we don't see any new shoots after the winter!

Our spiritual life is no different that what we see outside. If we want to produce fruit in our life, if we want to keep seeing new life, we need to stay connected to the vine, the vine of Jesus. In our faith, and at the core of our beliefs, we have the sacraments, especially the celebration of the Eucharist (Mass), to keep us connected to Jesus. In the Mass we are nourished by the Word that is proclaimed and certainly in our communion with the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ. It is pretty simple! If we are not connected we begin to wither away.

We have a few opportunities to stay connected to Jesus in the Eucharist once Mass is concluded. It is commonly called "adoration" or "exposition" or "holy hour." In each of these understandings we simply spend time with Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament, the Eucharist we reserve after each Mass. (The reason we reserve the Blessed Sacrament is to bring Jesus to the sick and homebound, the dying and for adoration.) Our time can be absolutely quiet or it can be a combination of words, music and silence.

Each Wednesday we have quiet adoration time with the exposed Blessed Sacrament (in the chapel that is in the parish office) from 11 am until 2 pm.

The first Monday of the month, in church, we have a "holy hour" at 7:00 pm. This time is a combination of more traditional music, a brief reading and reflection and some quiet time that concludes with Benediction (a blessing with the Blessed Sacrament).

Please consider these opportunities this week. Yes it is additional time outside of Sunday Mass, but time that is so important that helps us stay connected to the vine that supplies all that we need to produce so much good in our life!

- \*\* I encourage you to participate in our special "pilgrimage" 33 Days to Eucharistic Glory. It will only take a few minutes of your day for one month, but you will profit an enriched understanding about the Jesus in the Eucharist. Books are available for adults and children. Begin reading the book on May 1 and you will end on the feast of Corpus Christi. [You can also download the book to your Kindle at amazon.com] The Journals are available a great companion to help you through the journey.
- \*\* Please keep your First Communicants in your prayers this week as they prepare to receive Jesus for the first time next weekend.
- \*\* May is around the corner, believe it or not. May is traditionally devoted to Our Blessed Mother. At the end of May, after Memorial Day, we will once again gather at the Rosary Garden on Morningside to pray the rosary, weather permitting. Remember...7 pm on Thursdays after Memorial Day.

May our Blessed Mother, Our Lady Star of the Sea, keep us safe and bring us closer to Jesus and each other.

### Mass Intentions

#### What does it mean to have a Mass "offered" for someone?

An individual may ask a priest to offer a Mass for several reasons: for example, in thanksgiving, for the intentions of another person (such as on a birthday), or, as is most common, for the repose of the soul of someone who has died.

It is worth noting, however, that the offering of the Mass for that intention does not depend on it being publicly voiced but on it being specified in the priest's personal prayers. Similarly, if a priest announces that "I am offering this Mass for [such and such an] intention" he does not thereby require the rest of the congregation to pray for that intention.

Mass Intentions - Please Note: Mass intentions may be arranged by coming into the parish office. According to Archdiocesan Policy, the suggested donation is \$10 per Mass per person. Masses can be for the deceased (+) and the living, so please don't assume that a Mass being said for a living person, means that they are ill, please respect the privacy of all individuals. Mass intentions *must be* received 14 days prior to publication to be published and read at Mass.



#### What is the Catholic Services Appeal?

The Catholic Services Appeal is an annual campaign that raises funds for the Archdiocese of Detroit ministries, programs, and services that benefit all the faithful in southeast Michigan. This archdiocesan-wide campaign communicates that the local Church extends beyond the parish.

The CSA is an opportunity for the faithful to respond to Christ's command "to love one another as I have loved you" (John 15:12) by helping to fund services throughout the broader area of southeast Michigan. This collaborative, archdiocesan campaign is a way to demonstrate the unity of the larger Church and to fund these vital programs.

#### What does the CSA fund?

The Catholic Services Appeal benefits parishes and people in the Archdiocese of Detroit by helping to fund more than 170 ministries, programs, and services, including: support for men discerning God's call to the priesthood at Sacred Heart Major Seminary; campus ministry; grants to Catholic schools; and young adult programs. Essentially, CSA dollars help fund the spiritual and corporal works of mercy in the greater Detroit area.

#### Who oversees and distributes CSA funds?

The archdiocesan lay Finance Council oversees the distribution of CSA funds to ensure they reach the ministries, programs, and services for which they are intended.

#### Have CSA funds ever been used to settle judgments against the archdiocese?

No CSA dollars have ever been – or ever will be – used to settle claims of any nature against the archdiocese.

#### TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

The season of First Communions is here, and invitations pour in as the new communicants, mostly seven years old, gather extended families for their first reception of the Eucharist. Recently, the celebrations are often on Sundays, in the regular gatherings of the faith community. There, it becomes clear that First Communion is meant to initiate a regular pattern of reception, and that there is to be a second, third, hundredth, thousandth celebration.

Eastern Catholics and Orthodox children follow a different plan, since they are given a taste of the consecrated wine at their baptism as infants. We Western Christians delay until "the age of reason," but many years ago, Communion was not for children at all. Twelve to fourteen was the typical time for Roman Catholics to receive for the first time, and in those days this was a transition into the adult world of work and marriage. The custom did not begin to shift to childhood until reforms set in place by Pope St. Pius X began to take hold in the 1920s. If you are going to a First Communion, you can give thanks that the table of the Lord is today open so much more lavishly than before.


