ANOINTING OF THE SICK/ MINISTRY TO THE SICK

The Church strongly encourages people to receive the Sacrament (Anointing) of the Sick at the early stages of serious sickness or before serious surgeries.

In emergency situations needing the prompt attention of a priest, please call the parish office.

MARRIAGE

Must be a registered member, in good standing, of OLSOS.

Archdiocesan law requires advance notice of at least six months.

PARISH REGISTRATION

Newcomers to the parish may register in the Parish Office or online at OLSOS.org. Please notify the Parish Office of address changes.

Adults over 21 need to be registered as an individual member to be considered a Catholic in Good Standing.

Hearing devices are available for use during Mass. Please ask an usher for assistance.



"It is only because God himself is the eternal dialogue of love that he can speak and be spoken to. Only because he himself is relationship can we relate to him; only because he is love can he love and be loved in return. Only because he is threefold can he be the grain of wheat which dies and the bread of eternal life. Ultimately, then, Corpus Christi is an expression of faith in God, in love, in the fact that God is love. All that is said and done on Corpus Christi is in fact a single variation on the theme of love,

what it is and what it does. In one of his Corpus Christi hymns Thomas Aquinas put it beautifully, *nec sumptus consumitur* – love does not consume: it gives and, in giving, receives. And in giving it is not used up but renews itself. Since Corpus Christ is a confession of faith in love, it is totally appropriate that the day should focus on the mystery of transubstantiation. Love is transubstantiation, transformation. Corpus Christi tells us: Yes, there is such a thing as love, and therefore there is transformation, therefore there is hope. And hope gives us the strength to live and face the world. Perhaps it was good to have experienced doubts about the meaning of celebrating Corpus Christi, for it has led us to the rediscovery of a feast which, today, we need more than ever." [Pope Benedict XVI]

These words, though maybe a little "heavy," remind us again of the significance of this feast today as we celebrate the Body and Blood of Christ.

On this day, may we take the opportunity to be renewed by the mystery of the Eucharist and all that it teaches us, especially how to live our life. May we be renewed to spend time with the Lord, in private prayer, in adoration before the Tabernacle or during Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament. May we be especially renewed in our commitment to celebrate the Eucharist each and every Sunday, with our families, and allow the depths of what we celebrate transform us in our daily life!

Frequently Asked Questions

What is the procession route?

The procession will begin with the Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament at St. Paul on the Lake Catholic Church. The faithful will process along Lake Shore Road and conclude with Benediction at Our Lady Star of the Sea Catholic Church.

Where should we park?

Please park at St. Paul on the Lake. After the procession, buses will be available to take people from Our Lady Star of the Sea back to St. Paul.

Do I have to walk the whole way?

Recognizing that not everyone may be able to walk the entire route, we have a few spots where participants can join the procession.

- All are invited to the 12:00 noon Mass at St. Paul, after which we will start the procession; or meet us at 1:00 pm on the lake side lawn.
- 1:25 1:35 pm: the procession should be passing the corner of Moross and Lake Shore.
- 1:50 -2:00 pm: the procession should be passing the corner of Woodland Shores and Lake Shore
- 2:10 2:20 pm: the procession should be passing the corner of Ballantyne and Cook Road
- Approximately 2:20 2:30 pm: Benediction at Our Lady Star of the Sea, followed by fellowship in the Pointe.

You can join us anywhere on the route, or join us at Our Lady Star of the Sea for Benediction and fellowship.

Will we process even if it rains?

If it rains, the Eucharistic procession will continue as planned. Please bring an umbrella or raincoat. If dangerous weather is in the forecast, please check the website for updates.




What is the Catholic Services Appeal?


