Last Sunday brought to conclusion the 10th National Eucharistic Congress in Indianapolis. (The last one was 83 years ago!) About 60,000 people were present for the 5 days at Lucas Oil Stadium and the surrounding convention center. In the planning for three years as part of the National Eucharistic Revival as developed and sponsored by the US Bishops.

I was not present at the Congress but, thanks to technology, I was able to see the major parts of it as televised on EWTN. Weeks

prior to its start, there were four walking pilgrimage processions with the Blessed Sacrament from the four corners of the county, i.e., Connecticut, San Francisco, Minnesota, and Brownsville, Texas. They all arrived and converged at the stadium to start the congress! There were various talks in the afternoon for clergy, church ministers and personnel, religious, etc. There was 24 hour adoration of the Blessed Sacrament in a church, some small group Masses and a larger one every day. Various times (many hours) for confession and the sacrament of reconciliation where hundreds would experience the healing Grace of God. The big revival sessions were in the evening at Lucas Oil Stadium, accommodating the 60,000, for a few revival talks and then very powerful Holy Hours, i.e., a procession with the Blessed Sacrament in the monstrance, with music, silence, some prayers or litanies, concluding with benediction (blessing the gathered congregation with the Blessed Sacrament).

I am thankful for the televised evening sessions (commercial free!). The revival talks were stories of inspiration when people experienced the living presence of the Blessed Sacrament in their lives. Testimonies of change in people's lives because of time spent with the Blessed Sacrament. Following these stories, and then some music, the Blessed Sacrament was processed in, flooded with powerful spotlights, billowing incense, and placed on a altar for adoration. I found this time to be very moving. The prayers or the litanies prayed certainly drew people into the abundant love overflowing from living presence of Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament. The silence of 60,000 people focuses on the monstrance containing Jesus itself was penetrating to the heart. How often the various master of ceremonies of the evening would mention the love God has for us, the need to open our heart to the Lord, the reminder how God loves us where we are but continually invites us to come closer to His heart! How God wants to heal us, transform us, and wants simply to be with us on our journey in life! Powerful indeed!

Cardinal Tagle, the papal delegate who presided at the final Mass, sent the attendees forth to bring Christ to others. "Those who choose to stay with Jesus will be sent by Jesus," he said. "The gift of his presence and love for us will be our gift to people. We should not keep Jesus to ourselves. That is not discipleship. That is selfishness. The gift we have received we should give as a gift."

He invited them to "share Jesus' tender love" with "the weary, the hungry and suffering."

"Go and share Jesus' shepherd's caress to the lost, confused and weak. ... Go and share Jesus' gift of reconciliation and peace to those who are divided," he said. "A Eucharistic people is a missionary and evangelizing people," he said. "Let us proclaim Jesus joyfully and zealously for the life of the world!"

May we all continue to grow in our understanding of the Eucharist and the transforming power in our life, for the life of the world!





Stewardship Thoughts

Today's Scripture readings focus on God miraculously feeding the hungry. In the Second Book of Kings, the Lord uses the prophet Elisha as His instrument to supply nourishment for 100 men from 20 barley loaves. In St. John's Gospel, the evangelist tells of a time near Passover, when Jesus multiplies a few loaves and fish to accommodate more than 5.000 followers. Both passages point toward Christ's institution of the Eucharist at His Last Supper with His disciples. The Holy Eucharist is the "source and summit" of our faith. We become what we consume — receiving Christ frequently in Holy Communion can bring us to a deeper relationship with Him. St. Paul reminds us that we have received a calling from the one Lord in one faith and one Baptism. In a spirit of evangelization, we respond to this invitation to discipleship by personalizing Jesus in our life and then sharing our Eucharistic joy with everyone we meet.
