Half and Half from Msgr. Gary Smetanka

This Sunday we celebrate the *Rite of Enrollment* with our young candidates who desire to be confirmed in the spring of next year. In this Rite they step forward and express their commitment and engagement during this more intense period of study and reflection in preparation of receiving the Holy Spirit and the Sacrament. The Sacrament of Confirmation, like all the sacraments we receive, is not meant

to be “one and done” but only the beginning of God’s Grace in an aspect of our life. The Sacrament of Confirmation is not some type of graduation of religious education, or faith formation, but only the beginning of *putting into action* the faith received on the day of baptism.

Please pray for our candidates and their families making this commitment this Sunday. We all know the struggles in today’s age and culture to “keep holy the sabbath” and live out the Church’s teaching that we are obligated to participate in Sunday Eucharist each and every Sunday. [I often wonder if many Catholics somehow think that we only have to “go to church” on Christmas and Easter!] There are many pressures today to do plenty of other things instead of encountering the Lord, in his Word and in his Body and Blood, to nurture us and change us to become what we consume. Last Sunday’s opening prayer says it clearly, ...“grant that we may always conform our will to yours.” The Post Communion also hit the nail on the head: “Grant, O Lord, we pray, that, benefiting from participation in heavenly things, we may be helped by what you give us in this present age and prepared for the gifts that are eternal.” God knows what we need, that is why we are told to come together each and every Sunday and celebrate all that God gives us, especially the Body and Blood of Jesus. When you are tempted to do something else in place of Sunday Eucharist, just ask the Holy Spirit, received in Baptism and Confirmation, to help you celebrate the Eucharist and give witness to your faith!

**** Remember this Friday is All Saints Day and a Holy Day of Obligation. Masses are at 7:30 am, 10 am, and 7 pm. Saturday we Commemorate All Souls with a Mass of Remembrance at 10 am, specially recalling those who have been buried from our parish in the past year. All are welcome to participate in this Mass and recall all the faithful departed.**

**** The past weeks you have seen some changes on our campus. I do not like to cut down trees. However, sometimes there comes a time that they should be cut down because of disease or they no longer enhance the environment. That was the case with a number of trees in the parking lot and along Fairford. Many were diseased or so severely trimmed over the past years they no longer looked good. Please know we will replace those trees but not until the spring, avoiding all the piled up snow and salt around them on the parking lot!**

**** Thank you for your support of “Raise the Roof.” I know it is not a glamorous fundraiser but you know the importance of a good roof in your own homes. Rarely seen but certainly felt when it goes bad!!**

**** We continue with the ‘head counts’ at Mass over the next few weeks. These counts, taken across the archdiocese, help parishes to determine how many Masses need to be celebrated on a Sunday. The benchmark is to keep a Mass if the church is at half its capacity.**

Stewardship Thoughts

In today's Gospel, the evangelist St. Mark tells of Jesus' healing of Bartimaeus when witnessing this blind beggar's faith. He is then moved to discipleship in Christ and follows our Lord on the road. The prophet Jeremiah also narrates the journey and joy of God's deliverance of the ancient Israelites from Babylonian captivity. In the Letter to the Hebrews, the inspired author instructs how God calls men to the priesthood. In our quest for discipleship that begins at our Baptism, do we have the faith and courage to answer God's invitation to our life's vocation? Are we praying for solid families — the "Domestic Church" — that will be the seedbeds for vocations to the priesthood, religious life, permanent diaconate, and lay ministries?

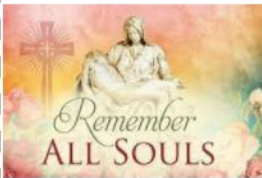
