ANOINTING OF THE SICK/ MINISTRY TO THE SICK

The Church strongly encourages people to receive the Sacrament (Anointing) of the Sick at the early stages of serious sickness or before serious surgeries.

In emergency situations needing the prompt attention of a priest, please call the parish office.

MARRIAGE

Must be a registered member, in good standing, of OLSOS. Archdiocesan law requires advance notice of at least six months.

PARISH REGISTRATION

Newcomers to the parish may register in the Parish Office or online at OLSOS.org. Please notify the Parish Office of address changes.

Adults over 21 need to be registered as an individual member to be considered a Catholic in Good Standing.

Stewardship Thoughts

The topics of family honor and obedience connect today's Scripture passages. The Book of Sirach instructs those who respectfully honor their father and revere their mother atone for their sins and in turn, store up riches. Those who are caregivers for aging parents are also remembered — their generosity is an offering against sin. In St. Luke's Gospel, Mary and Joseph find Jesus in the Temple after a frantic three-day search. The evangelist tells of their return to Nazareth, where Jesus is obedient to them. Pope St. John Paul II emphasized the family as the "Domestic Church." Archbishop Allen Vigneron also discusses the importance of the "Domestic Church" in his pastoral letter, Unleash the Gospel (see: Guidepost 7, Families. https://www.unleashthegospel.org). Please pray for faith-filled families, as their discipleship is the foundation for vocations to the priesthood, religious life, permanent diaconate, and other ministries to the Church.
