Today, February 2, is 40 days since Christmas. In some cultures, for many years, this day would officially bring to conclusion the Christmas season. In many ways it makes sense since Jesus spent 40 days in the desert, the 40 days of Lent, and there are 40 days of Easter to the traditional Ascension Thursday. The Church likes 40!

We celebrate the Presentation of the Lord today, when Jesus was presented in the temple to God. It commemorates the Jewish practice of the purification after childbirth of the mother, Mary, and the dedication of the child, Jesus, to God.

Today's celebration might also call to mind in many parents when they brought their child to the Church for Baptism. Parents bring their child for baptism for many reasons. The bottom line for most parents would probably be that their child be blessed and protected by God throughout the child's life, with faith and love of God in the child.

The faith of the child, like all aspects of the young child's life, is dependent upon the parents. There are also three reminders during the baptismal ritual of this dependence as the parents are asked three times if they are ready to raise the child in the practice of the faith. We forget sometimes that our faith needs practice, just like anything else in our life. Without practice, there is no development and growth.

I like this simple reflection for this day:

<u>"Life messages: 1) Every Holy Mass in which we participate is our presentation.</u>
Although we were officially presented to God on the day of our Baptism, we present ourselves and our dear ones on the altar before God our Father through our Savior Jesus Christ at every Holy Mass. Hence, we need to live our daily lives with the awareness both that we are dedicated people consecrated to God and that we are obliged to lead holy lives.

2) We need the assistance of the Holy Spirit to recognize the presence of Jesus in ourselves and in others: All those who, like Simeon and Anna, persevere in piety and in the service of God, no matter how insignificant their lives seem in men's eyes, become instruments the Holy Spirit uses to make Christ known to others. In His plan of redemption, God makes use of these simple souls to do much good for all mankind. In other words, The Holy Spirit employs ordinary men and women with simple faith as His instruments to bear witness to Christ, His ideals and teachings, just as He used Simeon and Anna. The Holy Spirit reveals the presence of the Lord to us when we are receptive and eager to receive Him. Let us be open to the promptings of the Holy Spirit within us to recognize the indwelling presence of the Lord with us and in others." (Fr. Antony Kadavil, Vatican News)

MASS INTENTIONS What does it mean to have a Mass "offered" for someone?

An individual may ask a priest to offer a Mass for several reasons: for example, in thanksgiving, for the intentions of another person (such as on a birthday), or, as is most common, for the repose of the soul of someone who has died.

It is worth noting, however, that the offering of the Mass for that intention does not depend on it being publicly voiced but on it being specified in the priest's personal prayers. Similarly, if a priest announces that "I am offering this Mass for [such and such an] intention" he does not thereby require the rest of the congregation to pray for that intention.


