The Church strongly encourages people to receive the Sacrament (Anointing) of the Sick at the early stages of serious sickness or before serious surgeries.

Must be a registered member, in good standing, of OLSOS. Archdiocesan law requires advance notice of at least six months.

What a day today (Sunday) should be! Super Bowl Sunday the eyes of the world will be looking and watching this huge sports event on opposite ends for the earth.

Two teams will compete today for the Vince Lombardi Trophy. His grandson, Joe, was the offensive coordinator for the Detroit Lions ten and eleven years ago and a few years ago was the offensive coordinator for the LA Chargers and the past two years for the Denver Broncos.

There is a man who is not afraid to put his faith into practice. A devote Catholic, he once drifted away from the Church and then returned after marriage. In an interview he said: "The Eucharist is the source and summit of our faith, so we should do everything we can to make it look and sound like that, rather than downplaying the fact. That's why I find it worth the effort to search for a Mass that's done well. It helps me to get a sharper sense of heavenly things and to pray better." He also said, "It's a privilege to be the father of a Catholic family, where you not only pass along natural life to your sons and daughters, but supernatural life, too. That's what matters most, what's way more important than any Super Bowl victories, however fun those may be. ...The Super Bowl is the attention-grabber, but the more relevant thing is to live your life according to the teachings of Jesus, which are found in their entirety in the Catholic Church." Imagine someone saying something like that! Thank you Joe and great words of wisdom indeed.

I know... we were all expecting the Detroit Lions to be playing this game. But it was not in the cards, or on the field, in the plan, or what God allowed! As we are used to saying here in Detroit, "there is always next year."

\*\* Tuesday, February 11, is the Feast of Our Lady of Lourdes. On this day we recall a series of 18 appearances that the Blessed Virgin Mary made to a 14-year-old French peasant girl, Saint Bernadette Soubirous. It was there at Lourdes that Our Lady said, "I am the Immaculate Conception." Our Lady instructed Bernadette to dig in the ground nearby, from which came a spring with healing properties, active to this day.

In more than 150 years of thousands of pilgrims visiting the grotto at Lourdes each year, 70 miracles have been officially declared, after very thorough investigations, from the intervention of God through the intercession of Our Lady of Lourdes. Hundreds and hundreds of other miracles have taken place not officially declared by the Church.

Lourdes, in the southern part of France, has always been a pilgrimage destination for those who are sick, for people who need healing. Naturally, we think of people who have physical sickness or infirmities, e.g., cancer, terrible arthritis, unforgiving back pain, tumors, etc. However, people also go there for spiritual and psychological healing. A few years ago I spent ten days at Lourdes assisting the English speaking chaplain. I can attest to the many spiritual healings that occurred through the Sacrament of Penance! It was a very powerful experience indeed!

This week, please offer special prayers for all the sick around the world and all their care givers. May Our Lady of Lourdes provide her special assistance and compassion.

Have a super Sunday and know God's love for you, and still loves the Detroit Lions!


